#### **Atlanta Braves Coming to Cobb**



The Cobb County Board of Commissioners approved a 30-year agreement on November 26 that will help build a \$672 million stadium for the Atlanta Braves in Cobb County.

Chairman Tim Lee expressed happiness with the decision. "This is an unparalleled opportunity for our county and will help propel our community into the foreseeable future," he said. "I am excited to be part of it." At least \$372 million of the stadium project will be paid for by the Atlanta Braves, which will also invest an additional \$400 million for an entertainment district on the 60-acre site. This will include retail, restaurants and other development projects on the location at the intersection of Interstates 285 and 75. Local costs will draw from various sources including payments by private businesses within a special district around the project, the motel/hotel tax and existing county revenues.

Lee said Cobb County will not increase the property tax millage rate for homeowners and its economy will be boosted by the project."In addition to construction jobs we anticipate from the creation of the stadium, crowds will bring steady employment for those who will work there." he said.

Road improvements are planned around the future stadium site, while there are already 14 points of access and service by Cobb County Transit to the area. Projects include a Windy Hill diverging diamond interchange and corridor improvements extending

from U.S. 41 to Powers Ferry Road, scheduled to open to traffic in 2017.

"We believe the new stadium location is easy to access while also giving our fans a first rate game day experience in and around the ballpark and making it a 365-day-a-year destination," said Atlanta Braves President John Schuerholz. The property, which has an Atlanta address and is located in Cobb

County, has easy access to I-75, I-285, U.S. 41/Cobb Parkway and a variety of other transportation options. The stadium will occupy a portion of the site, with the balance being used for parking, mixed use development and green space.

Officials anticipate the new stadium to be ready for Opening Day of the 2017 baseball season. Further details about the stadium project are available at homeofthebraves.com and cobbcounty.org.



Bethel United Methodist Church) participated in a Regional Robotics Tournament of the FIRST Lego League (FLL) last month and won! "Mindcrafters" Sam Franks, Dominic Krueger, Tripp Nichols, and Thomas Sharpless won first place for Robot Performance out of 24 teams. Also, their overall performance qualified them to move on to the Super-Regionals round in January 2014.

Each FLL season is based on a theme, which was Nature's Fury (preparation, survival, and recovery from natural disasters). Each tournament includes a robotics challenge--participants are judged on the quality and consistency of their robot's construction and programming and then compete in at least three robot games. The team with the highest single score of the three robot rounds wins the Robot Performance award, a project judging (they complete research on the theme, invent a solution for a related problem, and then make a presentation), and Core Values (FIRST promotes values such as Gracious Professionalism, Coopertition®, teamwork, and learning).

FIRST Lego League is a robotics program for 9 to 14 year olds, which is designed to get children excited about science and technology as well as teach them valuable employment and life skills. 

#### Making a Good Day Camp Decision For Your Child

















If you're a parent considering summer camp opportunities for your child, you might consider a day camp rather than (or in addition to) a sleepaway camp experience. Parents often view sending their kids to day camps as a "stepping stone" to overnight camp. They might think day camps are for "younger kids" and sleepaway camps are for older ones. In some cases this might be true, but not always.

One of the advantages you have as a parent when comparing day camps to overnight camps (or even day camps to day camps) is that a day camp's customer base is generally restricted to its local geographical area. This makes things easier for you to learn more about the camp. For example, you can contact the camp's current or former customers for references, and you can even visit the camp before making a decision.

So how do you know you're picking the right day camp for your child? Here's a 3-point checklist to help ensure the day camp you choose is the right one for your child.

1. Check references. Since day camps primarily serve local customers, it should not be difficult to find a few families who've attended the camp before. Talk to them about their impressions of the program. If you hear good things, you might have a winner. Mixed reviews, on the other hand, could be a "red flag" alerting you to research the camp further. But if everyone you speak with has only negative things to say, then rule that day camp out, pat yourself on the back for taking the time to conduct a thorough investigation, and keep looking for a different camp.

2. Involve your child in the decision making process. Research shows that kids enjoy camp more when they're

included in the decision-making process. Since there are so many different types of day camps to choose from, it's important to match your child's interests and personality with the activities the day camp offers. Accordingly, it's advisable to take a tour of the camp and/or attend an open house together with your child. After you've toured the camp, ask for your child's opinion. This can be a much better approach than unilaterally deciding which day camp your child will attend without consulting them ahead of time, as asking for their input means they'll probably have a more positive camp experience in the end.

3. Tour the camp and meet the staff. Most day camps hold open houses or organized facility tours during the prime camp enrollment season (generally springtime). These events are great opportunities for you to meet the staff, ask questions and see how the camp operates on a day-to-day basis. You might even decide to attend several camps' open houses for a point of comparison and to see where you get the best "vibe." Attending a day camp open house or touring the facility is the single BEST way to see what you're getting into ahead of time.

Camp is such a personal experience. You want your child to connect with his or her counselors on a personal level and admire them as leaders and role models. You owe it to yourself and your child to pick a day camp that your child will look back on later in life and say, "I remember that camp, and it was the best experience of my life!" Your child deserves the best. It's your responsibility as a parent to put him or her in an environment where they can thrive, and choosing the right day camp can make this happen for you. Happy day camping!

# Recipes of the Month: Lebanese Chicken Herisse + Brazilian Cheese Bread (Pão de Queijo)

The first class was November 19 in the Wheeler Culinary Arts Classroom. Guest chef Ms. Vera Abbud Vacaro, who currently lives in Brazil, decided to cook a dish from her grandfather's country, Lebanon, which is made in special occasions and has passed through generations. Another guest chef, Ms. Milca Moura, from Brazil, made Cheese Bread. Ms. Moura's son is a sophomore at Wheeler High School. Their recipes are featured below.

#### Lebanese Chicken Herisse

1 pound whole bulgur wheat

Water

1 chicken breast

2 chicken thighs

2 chicken drumstick

Salt

2 pounds ground beef

Butter

Cumin

Pine nuts (optional)

Soak bulgur wheat overnight.

Boil chicken pieces in water and salt.

Debone the chicken and reserve.

Strain chicken broth and reserve.

Cook the wheat in the chicken broth, and as it absorbs the broth, add the chicken and more chicken broth.

Chicken will shred as you stir the mixture.

Add salt to taste.

Brown ground beef in melted butter.

Add pine nuts.

Poor ground beef over chicken mixture.

Sprinkle cumin to taste.

#### Brazilian Cheese Bread (Pão de Queijo)

1 cup milk

1/2 cup canola oil

1 cup yucca flour

1 cup shredded parmesan cheese

8 eggs

1 tsp. salt

Preheat oven to 400 F degree.

In a saucepan, boil milk, oil and salt.

Place vucca flour in a bowl.

and scald it with the boiled mixture.


Add eggs and mix well.

- The statewide QBE (Quality Basic Education formula) cut for the fiscal year 2014 is \$1,051,425,164. The QBE cut for Cobb County is \$65,900,761.
- The statewide QBE cut per student for fiscal year 2014 is \$633. For Cobb County it is \$599.
- The cumulative statewide QBE cut from 2003 through 2014 is \$7,662,644,092. The cumulative QBE cut for Cobb County for this period is \$491,296,767.
- State funding per student declined on average 15.3 percent in inflation-adjusted dollars between fiscal year 2002 and fiscal year 2014. State funding per student in Cobb County declined 16.9 percent over this period.
- Over 45 percent of Cobb County's students are economically disadvantaged. This is an increase of 21.3 percentage points since 2002.
- Cobb County's tax digest (the value of its taxable property) fell by 17.8 percent between 2008 and 2012 as did the value of its tax digest per student.
- Cobb County's millage rate is 18.9, just below the state cap of 20.

# **Shaping Up Over Thirty**

When we get older we tend to evaluate ourselves: Do I like my job? Am I accomplishing all the things I set out to do? Is my relationship good with my significant other? All sorts of questions pop into our heads. As we approach 40, 50, 60 and beyond, the questions are a bit different than when we were twenty or thirty. How do I get rid of my spare tire on my belly? Why is my body making that noise? Where did all my energy go? What sort of diet and exercise do I need to start looking younger and felling better? These are some of the questions I will help answer.

Middle age doesn't have to encircle your middle with fat and threaten your health and looks. One of the reasons people exercise is for their appearance. But for people over forty the major reason should be health, stress-relief, and preserving their quality of life. Lack of physical activity and poor diet, taken together, are the second largest underlying cause of death in the United States (smoking is the #1cause.)

Staying active on a regular basis can help prevent or delay certain diseases (some types of cancer, heart disease, or diabetes) and disabilities as people get older. Regular exercise can offer relief to some diseases and disabilities in people. It can also improve mood and relieve stress and depression.

Evidence suggests that while time may be against you, you can compensate for a sluggish metabolism with resistance weight training. That's because weight training builds muscle and the more muscle you have on your body the higher your metabolism will be. Having muscle mass is really important because after age 30, no matter how much you exercise aerobically, you may lose a half-pound of lean muscle per year. This could result in a weight gain of 1-½ pounds of body fat per year, much of which is dispersed around your middle.

The good news is whether you start some sort of resistance training at 18 or 75 it will help keep you thin and in good health with a good metabolism. Resistance training targets the tummy and dissolves fat around the internal organs and the waistline. That's a tremendous fat and health benefit. Best of all, getting all these advantages takes less time then going out to dinner. Just 30 minutes of actual exercise 3 times per week. "Muscles at 75 are just as responsive to exercise as they are at 20,", says William J. Evans, PH.D.

So how do you get started? Just follow these four simple steps:

- First, get a personal fitness trainer to teach you how to work out the right way. Also, to take the guesswork out of nutrition and diet. Expect your trainer to set up a personalized diet and exercise program tailored to your individual needs.
- 2 Second, take the time to get at least 20 minutes of activity that makes you breathe hard at least three times each week. This is called cardiovascular or aerobic training. Even a moderate level of this type of activity (walking, jogging, etc.) will help.
- The third step is to keep your muscle. People lose their muscle and their strength as they age due to the lack of use. You know what they say 'if you don't use it you lose it." When you have enough muscle, it can mean the difference between being able to get up from a chair by your self and having to wait for someone to help you to get up. Don't wait for that to happen, get help from a professional trainer. A trainer will start with an exercise program that is tailored for your specific needs and activity level. You will probably work muscles you may have stopped using without even realizing it.
- The last step is to work on your flexibility and your balance. Here are some safety tips:
  - o Start slow. Build up your activities slowly. Don't over do it to by doing too much too soon.
  - o Avoid holding your breath while doing any strenuous activities.
  - If you have high blood pressure pay special attention to this tip - make sure you warm your muscles up before you stretch and before training with the weights.
  - o Drink lots of water. I would suggest a gallon a day.
  - o You also might want to get a heart rate monitor to monitor you heart rate during your training.

# 10 Things I Want My Daughter to Know About Working Out

Mid-way through a recent group exercise class, the teacher lost me. She didn't lose me because of some complicated step sequence or insanely long set of burpees; I mentally checked out because of a few words she kept saying over and over. "Come on! Get that body ready for your winter beach vacation! Think about how you want to look at those holiday parties! PICTURE HOW YOU'LL LOOK IN THAT DRESS!"

"THAT DRESS?" My brain couldn't focus on an image of some random dress hanging in my closet. All I could think about was my three-year-old daughter hearing and trying to process those words.

My daughter's little brain is making sense of the world every single second, taking in verbal and non-verbal cues about how things work and what things mean. And when it comes to exercise, I want her to grow up seeing it as a joy, and not a utility...as a gift, and not a chore... as an opportunity, not an obligation. I want her to do it for the love of it, not to fit into a dress. I want her to grow up knowing that...

- 1. Strength equals self-sufficiency. Being strong particularly as a woman is empowering. It will feel good someday to be able to carry your own luggage down the stairs if the airport escalator is broken, and it will be important to have a solid shot at outrunning a stranger should you meet one a dark alley.
- 2. Fitness opens doors. Being healthy and fit can help you see the world differently. The planet looks different from a bike or a pair of skis than it does from a car or an airplane. Out in the elements you have the time and space to notice details and meet people and remember smells and bugs and mud and rain and the feeling of warm sunshine on your face. And those are the moments that make up your life.
- 3. The bike is the new golf course. Being fit may help you get a seat at the table. Networking is no longer restricted to the golf course, and the stronger you are and the more people you can hang with on the road and trail the more people you'll meet.

- **4.** Exercise is a lifestyle, not an event. Being an active person isn't about taking a class three times a week at the gym. It's about things like biking to the grocery store and parking your car in the back of the lot and walking instead of taking a cab and catching up with friends on a hiking trail instead of a bar stool.
- **5. Health begets health.** Healthy behavior inspires healthy behavior. Exercise. Healthy eating. Solid sleep. Positive relationships. These things are all related.
- 6. Endorphins help you cope. A good sweat session can clear the slate. You will have days when nothing seems to go right...when you're dizzy with frustration or crying in despair. A workout can often turn things around.
- 7. Working out signals hard-working. The discipline required to work out on a regular basis signals success. Someone recently told me they are way more likely to hire marathon runners and mountain climbers because of the level of commitment that goes into those pursuits.
- **8.** If you feel beautiful, you look beautiful. Looking beautiful starts on the inside. And being fit and strong feels beautiful.
- **9. Nature rules.** And if you're able to hike/run/bike/swim/ski/snowshoe, you can see more of it.
- 10. Little eyes are always watching. We learn from each other. You may have a daughter—or a niece or a neighbor or a friend one day. And that little girl will be watching and listening to everything she you say and do. What messages do you want her to hear?

I'll never talk to my daughter about fitting into THAT DRESS. But I will talk to her about what it sounds like to hear pine needles crunching under my feet and what it feels like to cross a finish line and how special it is to see the world on foot. I will talk to her about hard work and self sufficiency. I will teach her the joy of working out by showing her I love it. And I'll leave the rest up to her.

# WellStar's East Cobb Health Park Update




