EAST COBB SIBLINGS ARRANGE ADVENTURES FOR A CAUSE

ould you take a stand for a cause you're committed to changing by walking 80 miles? What if you had to do it while carrying the special person you're raising awareness for on your shoulders the entire time?

From October 22-30, siblings Spencer, and Virginia Wyckoff led a nine-day, 79-mile hike through the Georgia portion of the Appalachian Trail. While that may seem ordinary, it was the trip's guest of honor, their sister Carden, that made the trek extra special. The drive and hike for some Georgians through the scenic trail sounds simple enough for most, but it was something far more complicated for Team Carden.

"I was diagnosed with Facioscapulohumeral muscular dystrophy (FSHD) at the age of 14," says Carden Wyckoff (Wheeler H.S., Class of 2011). FSHD is a form of muscular dystrophy that affects the skeletal muscles of the face, scapula, and upper arms. As a child she enjoyed the outdoors and could play without issue, but now Carden tires easily and can't travel long distances.

Ever since, her siblings, Spencer (Wheeler H.S., Class of 2006) and Virginia (Walton H.S., Class of 2014), along with a dedicated crew of partners and friends, arrange

piggyback adventures for their sister Carden. For this hike along the Appalachian Trail, sponsored by Vestigo, Spencer carried his sister, Carden, on his back using a specially designed harness. Their father, Kurt, and sister, Virginia, joined them on the adventure to spread the message that no matter what physical limitations are placed on you anyone can reach their goals.

"We are looking to prove that this journey, carrying someone on your back for 79 miles, is not impossible," said, big brother Spencer, "and that Carden and others with FSHD can do amazing things themselves every day."

This is not the first time Spencer and Carden have raised awareness about FSHD. Spencer also appeared on the Atlanta trials of American Ninja Warrior, and completed a Spartan Race carrying Carden earlier this year.

Carden is already looking forward to her next piggyback journey. "The next adventure may be going skiing," says Carden.

COBB CHRISTMAS **KEEPS HOLIDAY SPIRIT ALIVE**



obb Christmas, Inc., staffed 100% by volunteers, provides 3 toys to each child in need. Gifts are provided to the children ages infant through fifteen. A box of food is provided when available. With the help of hundreds of volunteers, Cobb Christmas is able to spread and keep alive the true spirit of Christmas—not to just their clients, but also to their donors and volunteers.

For one week each December you can actually see, hear, and touch Cobb Christmas during the Annual Distribution. From December 14-17, donations and purchases of over 16.000 toys are delivered to Cobb County's Jim Miller Park and over 400 volunteers sort and distribute these toys to approximately 1,000+ families.

Cobb Christmas partners with Cobb County Department of Transportation and Cobb Community Transit (CCT) to create the county's most unique and memorable holiday program, Stuff-A-Bus. Think of Stuff-A-Bus as the opposite of Santa's sleigh, Santa uses his sleigh to deliver gifts and Cobb Christmas makes a CCT bus our sleigh for collecting gifts.

The week prior to Cobb Christmas' Annual Distribution, a CCT bus travels through the county to Stuff-A-Bus host sites gathering donations of food and toys. Host sites can be businesses, schools and other entities that have organized toy and food drives.

This program would not be successful without the help of local businesses, schools, and other organizations that serve as host sites for Stuff-A-Bus. Volunteers at these locations organize food and toy drives and begin promoting and collecting in November. A Cobb Christmas representative schedules a date and time for the bus to make a stop at their location to collect the items which have been donated. All donations are stored and transported to Jim Miller Park the Cobb Christmas Distribution Site-during distribution week.

Individuals are encouraged to drop off donations at any of the "Stuff-A-Bus" scheduled stops. To find a stop near you, look at the Stuff-A-Bus schedule cobbchristmas.net/stuff-a-bus.

GEORGIA EPA **ISSUES WATER** RESTRICTIONS DUE TO DROUGHT

he Georgia Environmental Protection Division has issued watering restrictions due to drought conditions. Outdoor irrigation is permitted twice a week on the odd/even schedule. Even and unnumbered addresses may water on Wednesdays and Saturdays before 10 a.m. and after 4 p.m. Odd addresses may water on Thursdays and Sundays before 10 a.m. and after 4 p.m. Cobb County encourages citizens to practice water conservation.

Not allowed:

- Washing of hard surfaces (streets, gutters, sidewalks and driveways)
- Ornamental uses, such as fountains and waterfalls
- Washing vehicles (cars, boats, etc.) at home
- Non-commercial washing or pressure washing
- Charity, or non-commercial fund-raisers or car washes

Allowed anytime - no time of day restrictions:

- Irrigation of personal food gardens
- Irrigation of new and replanted seed or turf in landscapes for a period of 30 days following installation
- Watering with drip irrigation or soaker hoses,
- Hand watering with a hose with shut-off nozzles or watering can, bucket or milk jug
- Use of water withdrawn from private water well, creek, pond or lake on your property.

TRITT STUDENTS COLLECT CANNED FOOD FOR LOCAL FOOD BANK



merica has long been called the land of plenty. However, each year, millions of Americans go hungry. More than 43.15 million Americans live in households that don't have enough food, including 16.7 million children, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. That's a lot of people — many of whom depend on community food banks to make sure they have enough to eat. About 4 percent of all U.S. households — about 4.8 million — receive emergency food from a food bank at least once, according to Feeding America.

Last month, in a continuing effort to live their Tritt Elementary School motto of "Kind is the New Cool",

Becky Grindstaff and Debbie Edwards, school counselors at Tritt, spearheaded a schoolwide campaign--with their 5th grade students helping them all the way--to collect canned and nonperishable food items to be donated to the community's local food bank at the Catholic Church of St. Ann (4905 Roswell Road, Marietta/East Cobb). Homelessness is defined by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act to include, "children who may have a primary nighttime facility but said facility is not deemed appropriate for sleeping accommodations, children who are living in hotels, emergency or transitional shelter, cars or public space."

If we for just a moment put ourselves in these families' shoes, would we want compassion to be shown to us and our children? Would we want a helping hand to meet the needs we as parents could not fulfill for whatever reason? Would we want someone to show us the goodness and kindness of the human spirit just because it's the right thing to do?

This season our community has an amazing opportunity to get involved this holiday season by simply

asking this one question, "What is the need that I can help meet?"

There are many organizations hosting giving opportunities. Many local churches offer programs and ministries that you can be active in. MUST Ministries, Operation Christmas Child, and your local church food pantry are just a few of the places where you can be impactful. 

n Tuesday, November 8, registered voters across the country chose the 45th President of the United States. Below is a breakdown of how Cobb County residents and other Georgians voted last month to give the Republican presidential candidate, Donald Trump, the Peach State's 16 electoral votes in his ultimate victory over Democrat Hillary Clinton.

The Cobb County Board of Elections certified that 335,466 votes were cast during early voting and on Election Day. During the 2016 elections, Cobb experienced record early voting. According to Cobb Elections Director Janine Eveler, the votes cast were almost evenly split between early voting and Election

Day polls. The Board of Elections also certified 801 acceptable provisional ballots.

President-elect Donald Trump carried Georgia, but former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton received more votes in the traditionally Republican stronghold of Cobb County. Clinton received 160,121 votes in Cobb on Tuesday, good for 48.8 percent of the vote, while Trump received 152,912 votes, or about 46.8 percent, according to Cobb Elections. The last time a Democratic presidential candidate carried Cobb County was 1976, when Georgia native Jimmy Carter was elected. Carter took 56.7 percent of the Cobb vote in 1976, but unlike Clinton, he also carried the state.

GEORGIANS VOTE ONCONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

hile most attention this fall was focused on the presidential ballot, voters across the state also got to vote on failing schools, help for victims of sex trafficking, judicial oversight and trauma care funding.

Georgia currently does not allow any form of citizen initiated ballot measures, so all ballot measures must be referred by the legislature. The state legislative session ran from January 11 through March 25, 2016, during that time the Georgia legislature placed amendments on the ballot. Constitutional amendments must be approved by a majority of the electorate. East Cobbers, along with their fellow Georgians, got the chance to vote on the following four proposed amendments to the State Constitution on November 8. Here is how Cobb County residents and Georgians voted on these amendments:

AMENDMENT 1 – The Georgia Authorization of the State Government to Intervene in Failing Local Schools.

Approval of the amendment by voters was designed to trigger the implementation of Senate Bill 133. SB 133 provides for three governance models of schools under an "Opportunity School District" (OSD) agency:

- 1. direct management by the OSD;
- 2. shared governance between the OSD and local board of education; and
- 3. transformation of the school into a charter school.

A "yes" vote supports authorizing the state to form an Opportunity School District that would govern certain elementary and secondary schools determined to be "chronically failing."

AMENDMENT 2 – The Georgia Additional Penalties for Sex Crimes to Fund Services for Sexually Exploited Children. Addresses generating revenue for the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund. Allows the state legislature to provide for additional penalties or fees to a court case in which a person is found guilty "of keeping a place of prostitution, pimping, pandering, pandering by compulsion, solicitation of sodomy, masturbation for hire, trafficking of persons for sexual servitude, or sexual exploitation of children." It would also allow the legislature to impose assessments on adult entertainment establishments. Revenue from these penalties, fees, and assessments would be allocated to the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund.

A "yes" vote supports providing penalties for court cases involving certain sex crimes in order to allocate the generated revenue for the Safe Harbor for Sexually Exploited Children Fund.

Sponsors of Amendment 3's corresponding legislation argue that the commission has lost credibility and therefore needs to be

AMENDMENT 4 - The Georgia Uses of Revenue from

Taxes on Fireworks. The Georgia State Legislature legalized the sale of fireworks in 2015 through House Bill 110. The approval of this constitutional amendment was designed to allow the implementation of Senate Bill 350 and Senate Resolution 558. Senate Resolution 558 was designed to call for the proceeds of excise taxes raised from fireworks sales to be used for trauma care, fire services, and local public safety purposes. Senate Bill 350 was designed to specify the percentage of the proceeds that each of these areas would receive. Senate Bill 350 was designed to allocate revenue generated from fireworks sale excise taxes in the following way:

- 55 percent of revenue would go toward the Georgia Trauma Care Network Commission;
- 40 percent of revenue would go toward the Georgia Firefighter Standards and Training Council; Specifically, the revenue would be used to fund a grant program for improving the equipment and training of Georgia firefighters;
- 5 percent of revenue would go toward local governments, to be used specifically for public safety purposes.

A "yes" vote would dedicate revenue from fireworks sales taxes to trauma care, fire protection services and public safety.



SAFERIDE AMERICA: LEAVE YOUR DRIVING TO THEM

ave you ever thought how nice it would be to have a driver – maybe a lift home after an outpatient procedure or someone to drive you since night vision has become a problem? SafeRide America is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that provides affordable driver services for a myriad of community needs. A professional and reliable chauffeur drives you safely, in your car, from one place to another.

SafeRide America began offering it's driver-for-hire services way back in 2000. The drivers work in teams of two. A chase driver drives the lead driver to a pickup site. The lead driver then drives home that person who maybe imbibed too much in that individual's personal car. The chase driver will pick up the lead driver once the SafeRide is completed. SafeRide provides this service throughout the metro Atlanta area and will drive you any where you wish to go. It's like having your own private chauffeur. This service is available every day, on demand, or you can call them ahead of time to make a reservation.

"Our mission is to prevent all types of impaired driving," says Executive Director Michael Rhyne. "We provide a no excuses approach to solving the impaired driving issues that we all face. The fact is, none of us want to leave our car behind and we will risk everything just to have our car at home when we wake up the next morning." As a nonprofit, SafeRide will drive you and your car for free if you find yourself in a dire circumstance with no money to pay for the ride. "Our goal is to get you home safe," says Rhyne. "We try to eliminate any excuse one might have to drive impaired. Let us drive you home. You're life is priceless," he continues. "As an East Cobber, keeping our community streets safe is dear to my heart," Rhyne exclaims.

You can summon a SafeRide in a number of ways. You can call them via phone, sign up for a ride on their website, or summon a SafeRide via their SafeRideNOW app found in app stores. Your driver will arrive in a well-marked vehicle or totally discreet if you prefer. Once you request a SafeRide, it takes about 20 minutes for your driver team to arrive. Via texts, you receive alerts as to the



time of your driver's estimated arrival. While continuing the mission to get people home safely when alcohol is an issue, SafeRide America offers driving services for many different scenarios. For example, drivers are available for someone who can't drive following an outpatient procedure, for an older person who can no longer drive his or her car, or for someone who needs an extra driver to deliver a car for repair. Going to a concert or show? Yep, they provide services for that too. The cost is \$2 a minute (wheels turning) for transportation with no mileage or pickup fees. Or you can schedule a driver for an event, such as a UGA football game, for \$250 flat price.

"You won't find another nonprofit like SafeRide
America," says Rhyne. "We are a pure social enterprise
in that we are self-sustaining and receive no government
or outside funding. Our business is based on sound free
market principals. If it's important to our community, then
the community will support it and I can't think of a better
cause than keeping our community safe from impaired
driving. East Cobb is my home. I think we all want to keep
it safe."
