



Lorna Bulpin: East Cobber Mother of the Year 2017



Here is the winning essay written by 17-year-old Matilda Bishop, nominating her mom, Lorna Bulpin.

"I've been chronically ill with an undiagnosed illness for about 11 months now. At first, it was just me feeling unwell, but it progressed to the point where I could no longer function on my own. Sometimes seemingly simple tasks like dragging myself to the bathroom and brushing my teeth become ominous. Occasionally, I am unable to shower for days, unable to hold the strength to stand in the shower. For the first 6 months I was sick, we spent three of those in the hospital, where she would sleep on an uncomfortable pull out couch.

Through all this, my mother has been patient, understanding, and thick skinned as doctors and people have made offhand comments and mistreated us. We have travelled to far corners of the United States to receive what is supposedly the best care, only to be quickly disappointed to where my mother is in tears. Despite this, she still continues to take care of me and support me on my bad days, and

encourage me and be a "normal mother" on my good days.

She definitely deserves to be honored because of how she has managed to battle on and help me and the rest of our family despite the hardships my health has caused us.

She continues to work for Challenge Island, Ltd. where she works admin and teaches some of the classes. She also does the majority of the brunt work with caring for our home and my sister and father.

Not too long ago, when I was sick, my mother came down with appendicitis and had to be rushed to hospital. After having it removed she then caught a nasty infection and continued to battle on and care for us despite being in large amounts of pain. She then continued to care for my father when he came down with pneumonia from legionella.

Despite all these challenges, she manages to try and live a relatively normal life. I am so thankful for her and I know the rest of my family, and all those who have the pleasure of knowing her, are too."

STAR STUDENTS CELEBRATED AT ANNUAL BANQUET

The Student Teacher
Achievement Recognition
(STAR) program honors
Georgia's outstanding high school
seniors and the teachers who have
been most instrumental in their
academic development. During
the past 59 years, the STAR Program
has honored more than 26,000 high
school seniors who have in turn
chosen their STAR Teachers to share
in this recognition.

The STAR program was launched in 1958 by the Georgia Chamber of Commerce. In 1994, the Professional Association of Georgia Educators (PAGE) was invited to assume the responsibility for the oversight, administration and promotion of the statewide program. The 92,000 members of PAGE are honored to recognize

Georgia's future leaders and the professional educators who have nurtured these scholars.

Every accredited high school in Georgia is eligible to participate in the STAR program. To obtain the STAR nomination, high school seniors must have the highest score on the test date on the SAT taken through the November test date of their senior year and be in the top 10 percent or top 10 students of their class based on grade point average. Each high school STAR Student is asked to name his/her STAR Teacher. High school STAR Students compete for system titles; and system STAR Students in turn compete for region honors in the 12 STAR Regions. Region winners and their STAR teachers are invited to Atlanta to compete for the state STAR scholarships and awards.

Locally, STAR Students and STAR Teachers are honored by their schools and receive special recognition in their communities from the more than 165 civic organizations and businesses that serve as local sponsors of the STAR program. The State PAGE STAR Banquet, held in Atlanta last month, recognized local STAR students from all over Georgia.

ROOTS REACH DEEP FOR E. SMITH HEATING & AIR CONDITIONING

Earl and Rachel Smith probably had no idea 55 years ago when they started E. Smith Heating & Air Conditioning what their company would look like in 2017. Entrepreneurial in spirit and community-minded at heart, the co-founders set out to establish a successful business while, at the same time, using that platform to give back to their community. Still a family-owned and operated company, E. Smith continues to install, service and maintain heating

and cooling systems for East Cobb families and businesses. Debbie Smith Abernathy, vice president and daughter of Earl and Rachel, gives much credit for all the company's accomplishments to her mother, who passed away a year ago this May, as E. Smith celebrates its 55th anniversary.

The Smiths moved to Marietta, which was then rural countryside, in 1961. The next year they began E. Smith Heating & Air Conditioning, with Rachel as the first employee while Earl completed work at Bryant Atlanta Corporation. She handled the phones and accounting during the company's infancy. She continued to work at E. Smith her entire life. According to Debbie, even as her mom battled cancer, she worked until three weeks before her death at the age of 82.

With a heart for community, Rachel felt strongly about giving back. West Cobb's Calvary Children's Home was E. Smith's first charity and one that the company continues to support today both financially and through servicing their HVAC systems. In fact, all the memorial gifts given in Rachel's honor were presented to Calvary Children's Home, which provides a safe and loving Christian environment for children needing placement apart from their families.

Another favorite charity is the Earl Smith Strand Theatre, a historic landmark located on the Marietta Square. Built as an Art Deco movie theatre in 1935, The Strand Theatre (original name) was vacated in 2002. Many local citizens and businesses joined together to raise funds to reopen the theatre. Earl led the charge in coordinating a matching challenge campaign, and the theatre was renamed the Earl Smith Strand Theatre upon its reopening in January 2009. Members of E. Smith have served in various board positions, and the company was the presenting sponsor for this year's golf tournament.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 6 RACE GOES TO RUNOFF





The Congressional District 6 race is heading to a June 20 runoff election between Democrat Jon Ossoff and Republican Karen Handel. The two were the top votegetters April 18 among 18 candidates (11 Republicans, 5 Democrats, and two independents) seeking to replace Republican Tom Price. Tom Price resigned his Congressional seat to be sworn in as United States Secretary of Health and Human Services on February 10.

Ossoff received 48.1 percent of the vote, just short of the 50 percent threshold needed to win the seat, so he will face Karen Handel, the top Republican vote-getter, in the June 20 runoff.

Ossof earned 93,911 of the 193,483 ballots cast in the three-county district, which had an overall turnout of 43.5 percent for the special election. That gave Ossoff, who needed a simple majority to win outright, slightly more than 48.5 percent of the votes cast. Handel was second in the field with 37,993 votes, or 19.6 percent of the total cast, to qualify for the runoff.

Ossoff, whose occupation is listed as an investigative filmmaker, was also a former aide to 4th District U.S. Rep. Hank Johnson. For more information about Jon Ossof, visit electjon.com.

STATE SENATE RACE GOES TO RUNOFF





The State Senate District 32 race is heading to a May 16 runoff election between Democrat Christine Triebsch and Republican Dr. Kay Kirkpatrick. The two were the top vote-getters April 18 among eight candidates (5 Republicans and 3 Democrats) seeking to replace Republican Judson Hill. Judson Hill resigned his State Senate seat to run for the District 6 Congressional seat.

With 100% of precincts reporting, Triebsch, a Democrat, won the most votes --14,199 votes, 24 percent of the total votes. Republican candidate Kay Kirkpatrick earned 12,369 votes/21.09 percent of the vote total.

Christine Triebsch is a mother of 2 teenagers, and trial attorney with a focus in family and juvenile law. She received her law degree from John Marshall Law School in Atlanta in 1995. For more information about Christine Triebsch, visit www.christine4ga.com.

FIVE EAST COBB TEAMS HEADED TO **ODYSSEY OF THE MIND WORLD FINALS**



n May 24, teams from Mt. Bethel Elementary School, Dickerson Middle School and Walton High School will be headed to Michigan State University to compete for a 3-day competition in the 2017 Odyssey of the Mind World Finals. After achieving high scores at Georgia regional competitions in February and March, these five teams placed First or Second in their problem and division at the Georgia state competition held at Columbus State University on April 1.

More than 800 teams from 20+ countries, including China, India, Mexico and Russia are expected to compete this year. Odyssey of the Mind is a creative problem solving program for students ranging in age from kindergarten through college. Students work in teams of up to seven members to solve problems using "out of the box" thinking and creative skills for high scores. They compete at the Regional, State and World level against teams in their respective divisions, which are divided by grade. Primary Teams (K-2) are not eligible for the State or World competitions.

The teams will compete this year in three problem areas: Dickerson will compete in a balsa wood structure problem - their 15-gram structure held 580 pounds at the State competition. A second Dickerson team and a Walton team will travel back in time to discover the creative genius behind major works of art. The Mt. Bethel and second Walton team have created superheroes and sidekicks to battle the evil that is trying to steal creativity from the world with a cliffhanger ending.



Modeled after interscholastic sports, an Odyssey of the Mind competition combines the excitement of an athletic event with fun-filled zany mental gymnastics. Teams prepare for many months on both their long term problem solution and "on the spot" spontaneous problems that are part of the competition as well. Scores are weighted toward creative solutions. Although teams have coaches, outside assistance is strictly forbidden. Students can take full credit for their work.

The Odyssey of the Mind program dates back to the 1970s with its founder, Dr. C. Samuel Micklus, an innovative Industrial Design professor at Rowan University in New Jersey. Micklus challenged his students to use their creativity to solve unique problems, like building a vehicle without wheels, designing a mechanical pie thrower and others, as part of his course. The program evolved into a worldwide organization that presents five problems each year with emphasis on various creative skills, such as creating structures from balsa wood, designing vehicles with non-traditional power sources or twisting the classics.

NO ICE CREAM FOR THESE SENSITIVE TEETH!

I love the warm weather of the approaching summertime – a time when my family enjoys the beautiful sunshine and eats cold watermelon and homemade ice cream outside on our back porch. For people with sensitive teeth, however, this activity that my family so enjoys is not a treat. Cold foods and beverages make their teeth ache. Cavities and broken teeth can make the teeth sensitive, but if a dentist has ruled those out, the sensitivity may be coming from exposed root surfaces, missing enamel, cracks, or clenching/grinding of the teeth.

Roots often become exposed when the gum tissue recedes due to aggressive brushing, periodontal disease, or from clenching or grinding the teeth. Brushing hard at the junction between the tooth and gums can wear away the thin edge of tissue or cause it to retreat away from the tooth. With periodontal disease, as the bone level around the teeth drops, so does the gum level, exposing the tooth roots. Grinding your teeth, which often occurs at night during sleep, torques the teeth side to side and often loosens the ligaments that hold the teeth in their sockets, causing the gums to pull away from the teeth.

Enamel makes up the protective outer covering of the teeth. As enamel is worn away, whether through tooth grinding or chemical erosion, the dentin becomes exposed. The dentin layer of the tooth is porous, so when cold, hot, or acidic substances touch this layer, the nerves in the tooth are stimulated. Grinding your teeth can wear away the enamel on the chewing surfaces of the teeth and also can "bend" the tooth at the gumline causing the enamel in this area to chip away. Acid reflux and eating acidic foods or beverages are examples of sources of chemicals that can erode the enamel.

Cracks in the teeth can be caused by grinding the teeth, by a "bad bite," or by bad habits such as chewing ice. These cracks can lead down into the dentin layer allowing fluid to travel in and out of the tooth, aggravating the cells and nerves. Grinding or clenching your teeth puts excessive pressure on the teeth and over time, can cause a fracture in the tooth or can put such pressure on a filling that the tooth cracks. If your teeth don't fit together

properly, chewing can put heavier pressure on areas not designed to withstand such forces. Also, a bad bite or sleep disordered breathing can sometimes be the cause of nighttime grinding of the teeth.

There are many causes of tooth sensitivity. Left unchecked, sometimes the underlying cause can lead to major problems, so notify your dentist if you have any acute or chronic issues with tooth sensitivity.

COMMUNITY COMES TOGETHER TO SUPPORT THIRD ANNUAL MILES FOR MIKEY

ichael Warechowski IV is the only son of East Cobb residents Katie and Mike Warechowski, owners of Fitness Together East Cobb. Michael was born in 2010 a perfectly healthy, smart little boy who reached all his milestones. But when he didn't progress to walking, a series of tests



revealed a heartbreaking disorder. On his mother Katie's 31st birthday, they received the devastating news that their son had an incurable and fatal diagnosis - Metachromatic Leukodystrophy (MLD). Within 6 months he had lost all his physical abilities, endured two brain surgeries and multiple stays in the ICU. He is utterly dependent on others for every aspect of his care.

The symptoms of MLD, a degenerative disease, include muscle wasting and weakness, developmental delays, progressive loss of vision and blindness, convulsions, impaired swallowing and paralysis. Sadly, most children with this genetic disorder live just 5-10 years. Mikey is 7 and the Warechowskis pray he will be the exception and be with them much longer. Since the diagnosis, their lives have drastically changed, but their love and adoration for Mikey has multiplied exponentially. The costs to care for a child with MLD are staggering. Mikey

does not qualify for Medicaid and much of the medical supplies he needs is not covered by insurance. The cost of providing Mikey with care, sustainince and physical comfort is nearly \$30,000 annually.

Friends, family and local businesses are rallying together to support this young East Cobb family. The Third Annual "Miles

for Mikey," a 5K and Fun Run to raise funds for Mikey's care, is Saturday, May 13, at Mount Paran Christian School, 1275 Stanley Road in Kennesaw. Race Day registration begins at 9:00 a.m., the 5K start at 10am and the 1-Mile Family Fun Run begins at 10:15am. Registration is \$20 (\$25 on race day), students \$15 and children under 4 are free. All ages and strollers are welcome. Last year's race raised over \$15,000 for Mikey's care. To register, go to www.active.com/kennesaw-ga/running/distance-running-races/miles-for-mikey-2017.

"It is humbling, amazing and surreal how people, many we don't even know, want to help us," reflects Katie. "We wouldn't be able to provide our son with all he needs, all he deserves to live comfortably, safely and with dignity without this outpouring of support from our community. We really cannot find enough words to express our appreciation for so many that love Mikey too."
