In addition to standard pediatric dental services, Dr. Azi also offers hospital dentistry, as well as laser dentistry for infants who have breastfeeding issues.







ore than 12 years ago, their parents helped them pack their book bags, snapped photos and kissed them goodbye on their first day of kindergarten. Now, those students are preparing to take the first step into adulthood as they graduate from high school. Before they turn their tassels, dozens of Lassiter High School graduates in caps and gowns returned to the place where they learned how to read and maybe even how to tie their shoes—Davis Elementary School.

Sarah was also happy to see some of her elementary school teachers. One of Sarah's favorite teachers, Anne Ward, retired four years ago but returned to Davis to see the students she taught so many years ago. "I wouldn't miss this for the world," Ward said. Ward can still recall some of the projects the graduates did in her art class. "It is great to see these kids grown up," Ward added. "I remember teaching them as they grew from kindergarten through fifth grade, and it is so nice to come back and see that they really made it to graduating from high school."

Cindy Hill, who taught music at Davis for 25 years, also stopped by the school to see her young musicians all grown up. "It is a lot of fun for a teacher to be able to see what they have become, find out where they are going to school and to keep up with future plans," Hill said. She described the graduate walkthrough as a reunion for the kids, teachers and parents.

Sarah, who plans to attend the Georgia Institute of Technology and major in environmental engineering, had some advice for the current Davis Elementary students. "Work hard but still have fun," the Lassiter valedictorian advised. "It goes by a lot faster than you think it would."

THE EFFECTS OF DRUGS ON A TEENAGER'S TEETH

Living in the affluent East Cobb area not only provides our young adults with many cultural and educational opportunities but also, unfortunately, easy access to drugs and alcohol, the use of which can wreak havoc on the teeth and gums (not to mention the brain and the rest of the body!) There are many drugs that can have such deleterious effects, but I'll focus on three more common ones among teenagers: alcohol, marijuana, and methamphetamine.

Alcohol users are at greater risk of developing cancer in the mouth, throat and esophagus – as well as having tooth decay from the increased exposure to sugars and acids within the drink and from the drying effects of the alcohol on the oral tissues. People with alcohol abuse problems have been shown to have a higher incidence of periodontal disease, tooth decay and potentially precancerous oral lesions.

Marijuana abusers generally have poorer oral health than non-users, with an increased risk of cavities and periodontal disease. Marijuana smoke acts as a carcinogen and is associated with pre-malignant lesions within the oral tissues. Users are also prone to oral infections, possibly due to suppression of the immune system.

Methamphetamine users are known for having "meth mouth" - severe decay and erosion of the teeth. The primary compound in meth is anhydrous ammonia (farm fertilizer), along with lithium (from batteries), and lighter fluid, as well as other ingredients which are very acidic causing aggressive erosion of enamel, damage to the gum tissue, and destruction of dental restorations. This drug also causes dry mouth which leads to tooth decay - in a distinctive pattern often seen on the smooth surfaces of the teeth and the in-between surfaces of the front teeth. The rampant cavities seen in "meth mouth" can also be attributed to lack of a user's concern about oral hygiene combined with teeth grinding and a craving for carbohydrates and sweets. Meth causes the vessels that supply blood to oral tissues to shrink, and the reduced blood supply causes tissues to break down and die.

Alcohol, Marijuana, and
Methamphetamine are dangerous
drugs for people of any age, but
teenagers are still developing
physically. The developing body is
much more sensitive to the effects
of drugs. And drug and alcohol use
change the priorities of a person's life.
Instead of caring for their health, most
users spend their time caring for their

LOCAL NINJA WARRIORS COMPETE ON NATIONAL TV SHOW

n Monday night, June 26, at 8pm, tune in to American Ninja Warrior 2017 on NBC to see some of our very own East Cobbers and others in the area as they compete in a series of challenging obstacle courses. A team of six athletes from Ninja Quest Fitness, which is a training facility that's located at 3910 Canton Road in East Cobb, traveled to Daytona Beach, Florida for the competition in April. (This event is the one to be aired on June 26th.) The Daytona Beach competition is one of six qualifying regional city events around the country that leads to a national final in Las Vegas, which will be televised later in the summer. The winner of it all takes home \$1 million.

Ninja Quest Fitness Co-owner Glenn Davis, who has competed on the show in past seasons and now tests obstacles for the show, joined the competitors in Daytona Beach. According to Davis, the TV producers typically receive around 70,000 video submissions. These videos demonstrate an athlete's ability to tackle strenuous obstacle courses in a given amount of time. These obstacles test skills such as balance, side-to-side movement and wall climbing endurance. Each of the six qualifying city events accepts 100 competitors, and then fifteen from each city continue on to the finals.

How did Ninja Warriors make it to East Cobb? It all started with Davis. After competing in the show several years ago, Davis, who was a gymnastics instructor, saw a real

need for a local gym that could offer obstacle training skills.

"Ninja Warrior competition started as a television show in Japan in the late '90s and then caught on in the U.S.," explains Davis. "The American Ninja Warrior show is starting its ninth season, but our gym offers more than training for the show. Ninja Warrior is a new means of fitness and has become a sport in its own right. It's about overcoming obstacles for both adults and children and doesn't depend on ability, age, weight or height."

With the help of co-owner Cristine Henderson, who runs the facility's operations, Ninja Quest Fitness has been open for about two years, with 200-300 individuals training at the facility each week. According to Henderson and Davis, it's the biggest training facility of its type in Georgia and one of the best in the country for Ninja Warrior training. Four of the six athletes who you will see compete on TV are full-time trainers at Ninja Quest Fitness, while the other two teach classes as well. They are: Kara Birch, Kevin Carvone, Amy McCall, Nick Patel, Michael Poston and Ryan Stratis. Out of these competitors, Stratis made it to the finals in 2016. Because the show has not aired yet, this year's regional results can't be revealed.

Be sure to watch NBC on June 26th to support our local athletes as they strive to be the next winner on American Ninja Warrior.

EAST COBB ROAD CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Paper Mill Road and Woodlawn Traffic Light

The Cobb County Water Authority Project is moving quickly along Lower Roswell Road with more of the roadway opening up to two lane traffic. After looking at various options Commissioner Ott has asked DOT to change the traffic lights at Paper Mill and Woodlawn roads to a blinking red 3 way stop (previous configuration) which will require all cars to stop and proceed one at a time.

Paper Mill Road & Terrell Mill Water Project to start June 5

The Cobb County Water Authority has completed its pipeline installation along Lower Roswell in the vicinity of Paper Mill, water service to that general area of Cobb County should be much more reliable. Because that pipeline is now in a different location, the Cobb County Water System must upsize the existing 8-inch line along Paper Mill Road to accommodate the realignment. This project includes about 2,600 linear feet of 12-inch pipe installation along the south side of Paper Mill Road between Terrell Mill Road and Shadowlawn Road. It is anticipated that only the 600 feet closest to Terrell Mill will actually be in a travel lane. A third lane is available for most of that 600 feet Barring

technical issues of problematic weather, this portion of work should be completed during the first two weeks of June. The contractor is being allowed to work extended hours (7am to 7pm) so that they can complete this section as quickly as possible. This work is scheduled to begin June 5th to ensure that there will be minimal traffic impacts while school is in session. The remainder of the work is to be completed by the end of September. While there will be construction traffic in the area during this period, no lane closures are anticipated. Once the work is complete, water service in the entire area should be more reliable and capable of meeting growing water demands. The crews plan to work through the day on Saturday and be off on Sunday.

Little Willeo Road Closed for Bridge Replacement

Little Willeo Road will be closed from May 25 to July 28 for the replacement of the bridge over Timber Ridge Branch. As part of the replacement, pedestrian accommodations will be added to the bridge to connect the recently constructed sidewalks on either side.





CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 6 RUNOFF ELECTION SET FOR JUNE 20





The Congressional District 6 race is heading to a June 20 runoff election between Democrat Jon Ossoff and Republican Karen Handel. The two were the top vote-getters April 18 among 18 candidates (11 Republicans, 5 Democrats, and two independents) seeking to replace Republican Tom Price. Tom Price resigned his Congressional seat to be sworn in as United States Secretary of Health and Human Services on February 10.

Ossoff received 48.1 percent of the vote, just short of the 50 percent threshold needed to win the seat, so he will face Karen Handel, the top Republican vote-getter, in the June 20 runoff.

Ossof earned 93,911 of the 193,483 ballots cast in the three-county district, which had an overall turnout of 43.5 percent for the special election. That gave Ossoff, who needed a simple majority to win outright, slightly more than 48.5 percent of the votes cast. Handel was second in the field with 37,993 votes, or 19.6 percent of the total cast, to qualify for the runoff.

Ossoff, whose occupation is listed as an investigative filmmaker, was also a former aide to 4th District U.S. Rep. Hank Johnson. For more information about Jon Ossof, visit electjon.com.

STATE SENATE RUNOFF RESULTS





r. Kay Kirkpatrick, a Republican, defeated her Democratic opponent, attorney Christine Triebsch in the State Senate District 32 runoff election held last month. With 100% of precincts reporting, Kirkpatrick won with 17,571 votes, or 58.2 percent, and Triebsch earned 12,617 votes, or 41.79 percent, according to unofficial results from the Cobb County Board of Elections website.

The two were the top vote-getters April 18 among eight candidates (5 Republicans and 3 Democrats) seeking to replace Republican Judson Hill. Judson Hill resigned his State Senate seat to run for the District 6 Congressional seat.

According to the State of Georgia's Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report (filed 6 days before the runoff election), Kay Kirkpatrick received \$447,000 in contributions and spent \$395, 910.24. By contrast, Christine Triebsch received \$41, 283.59 in contributions and spent \$21,834.31.

estin, Florida is known for having one of the most beautiful beaches in the world, fantastic fishing, recreation, shopping and unique dining. fine selections of steaks and chops and shareable plates. The open-kitchen design restaurant also features a sushi bar as well as extensive outdoor terrace seating. With a striking octagonal-shaped design, Horizons Bar presents signature cocktails and panoramic views of the Gulf and adjacent nature preserve. I was so impressed with the food and décor, I called my friends who happened to be vacationing in Destin, and invited them for a dinner at Primrose, so they could discover a new and incredible place to dine in Destin!

I was able to escape to The Henderson's Salamander Spa for a one-hour massage. After my incredible massage, I lingered longer to enjoy the ladies steam room, sauna and whirlpool which overlooks the treetops of the secluded park. The Salamander Spa's friendly staff was attentive and very accommodating while I relaxed in the gorgeous lounge nibbling on nuts and filtered, flavored water! Although I was with my family this time, The Henderson and its spa would make for a great girlfriend getaway.

The Henderson also offers a sun-lit fitness room and a variety of other water experiences, including a family pool with a lazy river and an adult zone and pool. While basking in the glorious sun, I treated myself (and my family) to chilled drinks and lunch from the poolside grill. 

he Senior Citizen Council of Cobb County and Common Courtesy Rides are sponsoring doorto-door rides for members in a program. This personal ride service will pick up members from any location in Cobb County and take them up to 15 miles for \$2 per person per ride. There can be up to three people per car with a nominal charge for more than 15 miles. Riders are limited to two roundtrip rides per week. They must also belong to the Senior Citizen Council of Cobb County.

The Senior Citizen Council of Cobb County was formed in 1973. It is a tax-exempt nonprofit organization, sponsored by Cobb Senior Services, whose primary function is to further the common good and general welfare of Cobb County adults over the age of 55. It now embraces approximately 50 clubs and 3500 individual members. Other organizations striving to meet the needs of seniors in the community consider the Council as a role model in Georgia. The Council encourages seniors to stay involved in the community and provides a forum on aging issues. It also recognizes contributions made by senior volunteers and awards scholarships to students who plan to further their careers in gerontology. The Bulletin, a monthly newspaper, informs seniors about pertinent events, activities, trips and legislation.


