On the Cover

This month's front cover features longtime East Cobb resident Wylene Tritt. This past summer, the Cobb County Board of Commissioners (BOC) voted to expand the 13-acre East Cobb Park by almost 30 acres. Cobb County purchased 22 acres from Wylene Tritt with proceeds from the 2008 Cobb Parks Bond referendum and Wylene donated 7.7 acres.

A native Cobb County resident, Wylene moved to East Cobb in 1950. She and her husband built a home on the 80 acres they inherited from her husband's family. Their homestead is right next to the East Cobb Park on Roswell Road. The land on which the East Cobb Park sits was sold by the Tritts to the Bowles family. The Bowles property was later sold to be used as a park for all of East Cobb to enjoy. After years of being a housewife and raising her three children, Mrs. Tritt became a commercial realtor in 1979. She negotiated deals for much of the land throughout East Cobb that would become subdivisions and shopping centers.

The EAST COBBER would like to thank Mrs. Tritt and her family for her care of this property over the years as a lasting legacy for East Cobb, and for her generous land donation!



EAST COBB PARK EXPANDS DUE TO TRITT LAND PURCHASE

ecently, the Cobb County Board of Commissioners (BOC) voted to expand the East Cobb Park by almost 30 acres. With proceeds from the 2008 Cobb Parks Bond, the BOC approved the purchase of 22 acres owned by Wylene Tritt which sits right next to the current East Cobb Park. Mrs. Tritt donated another 7.7 acres and the Friends for the East Cobb Park's generous donation of \$102,000 allowed the East Cobb Park to increase its 13-acre plot to 29.7 acres.

East Cobb Park has become one of the most heavily used parks in Cobb County and includes walking trails, pavilions, open grass areas, creek overlooks and playgrounds. This acquisition adds to the greenspace preserved with the 2008 Park Bond funds. For now, the newly acquired land will remain a green space. It's the only land in District 2 that was purchased with the parks bond funding.

Friends for the East Cobb Park (FFECP) is the nonprofit group of community volunteers who raised more than \$1 million to purchase the original 3 acres to create the East Cobb Park almost 20 years ago. The Friends board is planning a community-wide fundraising campaign to replenish the park's endowment fund. The Friends group invites the community to help restore the fund which will help ensure the future growth of our community's beloved park. In advance of the campaign's official kickoff, volunteers will be at the EAST COBBER Parade & Festival and at upcoming Sunday Fun Day events at East Cobb Park. 

PTA PRESENTS CONSEQUENCES OF CRIME

ormer ECCC (East Cobb County Council) PTA
President, Margie Hatfield, in 1980 had a vision to
educate Cobb County youths about the real-life
consequences of making poor choices. She recognized
that students starting in fifth grade through twelfth grade
were vulnerable to becoming involved in criminal activities and needed guidance and education about how
what seems like a minor crime can lead to grave consequences. Cobb County Sheriff's Office partners each
year with ECCC PTA to provide the Consequences of
Crime program.

The Sheriff's Office recognizes the inherent differences of students in this wide grade span and presents an age/grade appropriate program. While the educational focus has remained a constant over the program's history, the content and style of the program is often evaluated to maintain relevancy while at the same time capturing the attention of students.

The Consequences of Crime program is loosely divided into 3 phases and lasts approximately 2 hours. The first phase consists of a brief overall view of the Cobb County jail and the criminal justice system as a whole. Sheriff's Office representatives explain and discuss the steps an arrested individual faces beginning with the initial jail book-in, the movement of a case through the court system, and the subsequent outcome be it probation or imprisonment. Students learn the technical meaning of terms such as bond, pre-trial, probation and conviction. The second phase provides an eye-opening view of daily jail life. Students no longer tour the current jail housing area, but have a chance to see a jail facility dating back to the 1940's. This facility has not housed inmates in recent years, but shares the realistic conditions of jail confinement. Much of this phase is presented in a boot camp style format which serves to shock students and hold their attention. The third phase facilitates a dialogue between students and carefully selected male

and female inmate workers. Sheriff's Office representatives are always present during this time. This unscripted question and answer session encourages student participation and allows each inmate to relate their personal story and detail factors which led to their incarceration. The interaction with inmates reinforces the educational message Sheriff's Office representatives present in "Consequences of Crime".

Research indicates drugs and/or alcohol is the leading factor in the incarceration of 2 out of 3 individuals. Further, nearly half of all individuals incarcerated do not have a high school diploma. These national statistics are generally consistent with the Cobb County jail population as well. Therefore, Sheriff's Office representatives reiterate the importance of staying in school, choosing friends wisely and maintaining a life free from the influence of alcohol or drugs throughout the 2-hour program.

This powerful program has left lasting impressions on both the students and adults who have attended. They are expected to share their lessons with the rest of their classmates through innovative means such as group discussions, writing an article for their newspaper, or sharing through a documentary. The underlying message to students throughout the program is to focus on making good choices and decisions and how a single bad choice or series of bad choices can potentially affect the rest of one's life.





RUN WITH YOUR DOG AT THE ATLANTA LAB RESCUE ROAD RACE



since 2009, Atlanta Lab Rescue (ALR) has been rescuing Labrador Retrievers and Lab Mixes from overwhelmed shelters and abusive situations and placing them in secure, loving homes. Atlanta Lab Rescue averages 35-40 dogs in the program at any given time, and in their first ten years, they have rescued over 3,400 dogs.

To help underwrite their rescue efforts, ALR is holding its 4th Annual Atlanta LabRescue 5K on Sunday, November 18 at Jim Miller Park which is located at 2245 Callaway Road, Marietta. It is the largest fundraiser for Atlanta Lab Rescue. The Atlanta Lab Rescue 5K is open to the community, including: children, strollers and dogs! Yes, runners are encouraged to race with their dogs. Participating dogs should have current shots and rabies vaccination, wear an ID Tag, accustomed to regular exercise, be well-adjusted to crowds and noisy environments with large numbers of people and other dogs. Children under 7 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian during the race and dogs must be on a leash at all times per Cobb County laws.

The link to sign up is runsignup.com/Race/GA/Marietta/AtlantaLabRescue. The race entry will be \$35 and race day registration will be \$40 for the 5K. Runsignup.com registration will close on November 14th at midnight.

What do I do if my dog or cat bites someone?

You will be required to make a decision about the future of your pet. Confinement is a must under the Cobb County Animal Control Ordinance. This quarantine/confinement is necessary for 10 days. You can choose to augrantine the animal at your vet or the Cobb County Animal Control Shelter. If you do not choose to keep the animal because of the bite, you can request that the animal be put to sleep and tested for rabies. Neither of these options are pleasant, but because of the potential for rabies exposure and/or liability on your part you must make the decision that is best for your situation. Animal Control does not normally adopt out animals that have bitten or scratched, but every situation is considered individually.

Lost & Found Rules & Regulations

- Upon receipt of any domestic animal impounded, wearing a tag, the Cobb County Animal Control Division will make diligent efforts to ascertain the identity of the animal's owner and, if identified, shall, within 24 hours of receipt, contact the owner by telephone. It shall send notice of impoundment to the owner by mail.
- All animals impounded shall be kept at the Animal Control Center for a period of not less than 5 working days unless redeemed within that period.
- Any animal not redeemed shall be considered abandoned to the Animal Control Division, in which all rights of ownership shall vest in the Animal Control Division; and the owner shall have no further claim to such animal.
- The owner must go to the Animal Control Shelter during normal hours to reclaim the pet. You must bring an I.D. (Drivers License or Georgia I.D.) and proof of ownership such as Vet Records. For more info call: 770-499-4136

THE GREAT AMERICAN SMOKEOUT: **NOVEMBER 15**

The American Cancer Society marks the Great American Smokeout on the third Thursday of November each year by encouraging smokers to use the date to make a plan to quit, or to plan in advance and quit smoking that day. By quitting — even for one day — smokers will be taking an important step towards a healthier life – one that can lead to reducing cancer risk.

Tobacco use remains the single largest preventable cause of disease and premature death in the United States, yet about 37.8 million American-15.5 percent of all Americans- still smoke cigarettes.

Cigarette smoking is the leading cause of cancer death in the United States, accounting for 29% of all cancer deaths. Nearly 12,000 people die in Georgia every year from tobacco-related illnesses—that's more than all the deaths from alcohol, cocaine, heroin, AIDS, murder, suicide, auto accidents and fires combined. In spite of these chilling statistics, approximately 18 percent of Georgia adults smoke. In 2017, 12.8% of Georgia high school students smoked cigarettes.

The Tobacco Quit Line is a resource to help Georgians quit using tobacco. Quit coaches improve the chances

of quitting by fifty percent. They provide free counseling, a resource library, support and referral services for tobacco users. It is available for all Georgia residents age 13 or older. The Tobacco Quit Line is funded by the master tobacco settlement through the state's Tobacco Use Prevention Section in partnership with the Georgia Cancer Coalition. It has no commercial bias and no products to promote. As a caller, you will receive free, professional support that's tailored to your needs.

At the Quit Line, a counselor conducts an initial interview with a caller to determine tobacco usage and willingness to quit. An assessment is made based on the caller's needs and multiple options are presented. Callers will receive a customized quit plan, including up to five additional counseling phone calls. Up-to-date information about physician-recommended pharmacological support, such as nicotine gum, nicotine patches, and other items are available. A Tobacco Quit Kit, including materials tailored to the caller's readiness to quit is also available.


