

PTA PROMOTES EVERY KID IN A PARK

n his international bestseller Last Child in the Woods, Richard Louv writes about the alienation of children from the natural world and outlines the benefits of a strong connection to nature. His research shows that the benefits of being outside range from boosting mental alertness and creativity to reducing obesity and depression, from promoting health and wellness to simply having fun.

Connecting our nation's youth to the great outdoors is even more important at a time when 80 percent of American families live in cities or suburbs, and most children spend more time on computers and smartphones than exploring nature.

As part of a national effort to connect more kids to nature and to teach students the importance of protecting our public lands, the Every Kid in a Park program is a nationwide effort to create a new generation of outdoor enthusiasts.

The program allows all fourth graders (or home school equivalent) to receive a FREE one year pass for themselves and their family to visit ALL federal parks, lands and waters. With over 2,000 sites across the country, every person is within two hours of a site to use the pass. There are over 150 sites within an hour and a half drive from East Cobb. Here are a few destinations nearby families can go to:

- See Protected Animals at a National Wildlife Refuge. Georgia is home to a group of seven Wildlife Refuges along the coast that create a protected habitat for many species such as bobcats and alligators, and the inland marsh attracts thousands of migratory birds every year. Closer to home you can visit the Piedmont Wildlife Refuge and try to catch a glimpse of an endangered Red-cockaded woodpecker. Use their website to search for a Refuge near you. www.fws.gov/refuges
- Visit the Woods. We are fortunate to have both National and State Forests practically in our backyard. Use www.discovertheforest.org/ to find dozens of sites to explore. The Chattahoochee-Oconee National Forest is only an hour and a half drive and a perfect day trip with kids. Mountain hikes and breathtaking waterfalls make the drive more than worth it. Be sure to download the free Agents of Discovery app before you go. It is a game that uses augmented reality to actively

engage kids in learning about our public lands. Or try the Nature Next Door challenge to go on a nature scavenger hunt, learn about the forests through an artistic lens, or simply enjoy a familyfriendly outdoor workout.

- Go to a Park. Want something a little tamer? At www.findyourpark.com you can search by state to find new places to explore that aren't too far off the beaten path. A family favorite is the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area just outside of downtown Roswell. You can enjoy an easy hike on manicured paths along the Chattahoochee River, or just bring your lunch and have a picnic along the river bank. You can also rent kayaks or rafts and float the river.
- Watch History Come Alive. The website www.recreation.gov lets you search for even more options to use the Every Kid in a Park Pass. Tours of local historic sites are included so if you have been meaning to venture in town and visit the Martin Luther King Jr National Historic Site or the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library, now is your chance to do so.

Get your free pass at www.everykidinapark.gov. The Every Kid in a Park pass is good at thousands of National Parks, Forests, Wild and Scenic Rivers, and historic landmarks across the country. With Winter Break and Spring Break on the horizon, be sure to check out the many sites you can visit. The Every Kid in a Park pass is valid until August 31, 2019 so you still have months left to explore and enjoy the benefits.

AN IMPORTANT ADDITION TO YOUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

As we enjoy the holiday season, we are reminded that a new year is fast approaching. We begin thinking of resolutions we will make in the new year, such as eating healthier or exercising more regularly – actions that are sure to improve our health and well being. This year, I urge you to add one more resolution to your list, one that will not only improve your dental health, but can also improve your overall wellness – flossing!

Flossing is an essential part of taking care of your teeth and gums and should be done daily. Cleaning between your teeth with floss can help prevent cavities and gum disease by removing plaque that often accumulates there. Plaque contains bacteria that feed on leftover food and sugar in your mouth. When this happens, it releases an acid that weakens the adjacent enamel causing cavities. If plaque is not removed, it hardens into tartar (or calculus) which collects along and below the gum line causing gum disease. Once tarter forms, only your dentist or hygienist can remove it. Also, many medical studies have shown a link between gum disease and heart disease. We now we believe that if excessive oral bacteria enter the bloodstream, it can lead to atherosclerosis, so removal of this bacteria from your teeth and gums is important for the health of your arteries as well!

Using the proper technique when flossing is critical because simply snapping the floss between the teeth does not remove much plaque. Begin by breaking off about 18 inches of floss and winding most of it around one of your middle fingers. Wind the remaining floss around your opposite middle finger and then hold the floss tightly between your thumbs and forefingers. Guide the floss gently between your teeth, and when the floss reaches the gum line, curve the floss into a C shape against the side of one tooth. While maintaining this C shape, slide the floss into the space between the

tooth and gum and gently rub the side of the tooth with up and down motions going under the gums. Curve the floss into a C around the adjacent tooth and repeat the motion. Repeat this process on every tooth in your mouth including the back side of the very last tooth in each corner of your mouth.

Starting and maintaining a new habit can be difficult. Though flossing may be uncomfortable and your gums may bleed a bit when you first

begin, stick with it! The discomfort and bleeding should ease within a week or two, and your teeth, gums and arteries will be happier and healthier thanks to your effort!



December 1st

Fit for Travel

Traveling is to Christmas what pilgrims are to Thanksgiving. Airports bustle, bus depots buzz, highways jam – because Christmas is the season for traveling. It goes back in history as far as...well, Mary and Joseph.

I invite you to travel along with me on a 25-day journey. Not by train, plane, or automobile – but by story. Together, we'll stroll through the Biblical record of people moving toward the Christ. Our destination is not Christmas, mind you – but the Christ of Christmas. So, as we travel there December days to Christmas, let's travel towards Christ Jesus.

The first traveler of Christmas we'll look at, here on Day One of our journey, is the one in the mirror.

Take time today to examine your traditions to see the meaning and purpose that lies behind them. Ask yourself if you truly understand what it is you believe about what you're celebrating.

Typically, traveling requires much preparation. It calls for advance planning and packing. Don't pack. In fact, it's best if you unpack. Unpack your hurries and worries...your unrealistic expectations. Empty your mind of unnecessary baggage and clear your overpacked schedule. Simply commit to take time out each day to sojourn with Jesus.

So, check your baggage here at the gate. Honestly assess your fitness for travel – heart, mind, soul and strength...

ROBOCALLS HAVE SKYROCKETED!

Let me guess how your day goes. Your phone rings constantly with random, unrecognizable phone numbers from people that you may or may not have requested information from. You are getting frustrated to the point where you don't even want to answer the phone anymore. Sound familiar? It does to me, because that is what I deal with each day and I am 100% confident that I have never called or went online requesting information on health insurance. Unfortunately, there is more you should be worried about besides them being inconvenient. These calls can potentially endanger your finances. If you do end up speaking to one of these callers, make sure you take proper steps to safeguard yourself and your identity. This is not to say that everyone who calls



you is unethical or out to take advantage of you but there are some who do, and I want to ensure everyone is properly informed and uses proper precaution when transacting business online or over the phone.

I would like to share a story of personal experience, so it might help you look for the warning signs. The other day, I received a phone call from a number I usually see call at least five to seven times a day. I was curious to see what exactly they were offering. It must have been important for the sheer number of times they had called. The call was automated, and I had to follow prompts to be connected to an actual agent. Once connected to an actual person, the gentleman proceeded to sell me what he claimed was a Major Medical plan. This plan had a \$0 deductible. He said this plan didn't have a network and I could see any doctor I chose. He indicated that the hospital coverage was \$1000 per day with no limit on the number of days! He asked if that sounds good so far. To the average consumer they may think, "Yes, that sounds great!" With my knowledge I said, "WAIT! \$1000 per day in the hospital? That won't even cover the room charges." Fun fact, according to CBS news Money Talk, the average hospital stay for a heart attack is five days and the cost is around \$760,000!! Using the plan he was selling, as an example, \$1000 per day for 5 days that's only \$5,000 in coverage. So, what happens to the other \$755,000? Yep, you guessed it; YOU have to pay that out of your own pocket. As I proceeded to pull back the layers, I realized the plan was trying to sell me was a just a Hospital Indemnity plan, not a true Major Medical plan that he originally claimed it to be. After 10 minutes on the call, I pushed him to verify that he was a licensed agent with the ability to sell insurance. Come to find out, he wasn't even licensed to sell insurance, so I immediately ended the phone call. Do you know, he had the nerve to call me back to say he was frustrated with ME for wasting his time. For training purposes our calls are always recorded so I was able to go back and listen to our entire call. I have linked this call on our website, so you can listen, too. www.insurd.net/telemarketer

TOYS FOR TOTS SEEKS DONATIONS

s the holidays are upon us and planning for Christmas arrives, it's also time to think about doing something special for children in need. Toys for Tots is a program which brings all elements of a community together in a common cause for three months each year. It is a program dedicated to helping in the development of our nation's most valuable natural resource: our children. The shiny new toy at Christmas lets these youngsters know that someone cares.

Toys for Tots collects only new toys. Organizers ask that toys brought to drop-off points be unwrapped so they can be sorted and given to the right child. Toys are to be appropriate for children from birth to 12 years.

GEORGIANS VOTE ON CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

While most attention was focused on the midterm elections, voters across the state also got to vote on amendments to the Georgia constitution as well as local and statewide referendums. Georgia currently does not allow any form of citizen initiated ballot measures, so all ballot measures must be referred by the legislature. Constitutional amendments must be approved by a majority of the electorate. East Cobbers, along with their fellow Georgians, got the chance to vote on the following five proposed amendments to the State Constitution on November 6. The following presents how Cobb County residents and Georgians voted on those amendments.

AMENDMENT #1: OUTDOOR STEWARDSHIP

A proposed amendment to the state constitution would put more money toward preserving Georgia's parks, trails and hunting land - but wouldn't cost taxpayers any more money. This would take sales tax from outdoor equipment like camping gear or fishing equipment and reserve it for various outdoor projects in the state.

AMENDMENT #2: STATEWIDE BUSINESS COURT

Billed as a pro-business and cost-saving measure, this proposal would create statewide business courts. Judges in these courts would be appointed by the governor to five-year terms with the approval of the Senate Judiciary Committee and its counterpart in the House. The amendment cuts out of the process voters, who currently elect all trial court and appeals court judges.

AMENDMENT #3: FOREST CONSERVATION

Right now, property values are locked in for land used by timber growers. This amendment allows the state to re-evaluate how much the land is worth yearly. It's meant to be fairer for both the government and the landowner. Designed to encourage more landowners to preserve their timberland. In return, they get a better tax rate. The state will also collect money to run a program that sends money back to rural counties that have more timberland.

GEORGIA REFERENDUM A: HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

This referendum allows homestead exemption in homes that are located in more than one county. Voting yes meant you support the measure to provide a homestead property tax exemption for some cities equal to the difference between the current year and the adjusted base year. This referendum will become law and take effect on January 1, 2019 and will apply to all tax years beginning on or after that date.



SUNDAY BRUNCH BILL

East Cobbers also had to vote on a local ballot measure, the "mimosa mandate," which allows the sale of alcohol at restaurants and bars to begin at 11am on Sundays rather than 12:30pm. Georgia Gov. Nathan Deal signed Senate Bill 17 in May — the "Sunday Brunch Bill" or "mimosa mandate" — making it the law of the land. However, residents throughout the state had to vote to include the new law on the books in their communities. A "yes" vote is in favor of allowing the sale of alcohol in restaurants and bars to begin at 11am on Sunday morning in a specific city/county.


