





POLICEMEN TO HONOR FALLEN OFFICERS IN CHARITY BIKE RIDE

ike Flisser, an East Cobber and Atlanta police officer, is training for a 200-mile charity bicycle ride, the proceeds from which go toward memorializing fallen police officers and other charities that support police families. The ride is a fundraiser created by Law Enforcement United (LEU) a national non-profit that began in 2009. The ride is from May 9-12 this year, and Sgt. Flisser, who is captain of the Atlanta cycling team, will ride along with eleven other Atlanta law enforcement officers from Atlantic City, NJ to Washington, DC. Overall, there will be 1,000 riders from 36 states from all over the county riding to raise money for these following LEU projects:

This year, Sgt. Flisser is riding specifically in memory of Dekalb County police officer, 24-year-old Edgar Flores, who was killed in the line of duty this past December during a routine traffic stop.

Cycling in this ride is Mike's way of giving back to the families who have lost officers in the line of duty and honoring the sacrifice by his fellow police officers. He wants his participation to remind communities of the sacrifices made by law enforcement professionals, to show his respect for law enforcement officers and to show love to the survivors left behind after a line of duty death.

FINDING A GOOD DENTIST FOR YOUR FAMILY

As a mom of three, I know the pressures we moms feel in making decisions for our kids' health. We buy organic when possible, we try to make sure our kids get outside and aren't glued to their electronics all weekend, and we research online and among neighbors when trying to find healthcare providers like pediatricians and dentists. But how do you really know if a dentist is "good?" Do you seek the opinions of neighbors and co-workers? Co-workers and neighbors can be good resources for recommending a dentist based on the dentist's personality, gentleness, and appearance of the office, but may not always know if the work being done is of high quality. However, word-of-mouth recommendations are a good place to start. Reading online reviews next to be sure that others have the same great experience is important as well.

Other things to consider when selecting a dentist for your family are whether or not you are able to get an appointment within a reasonable period of time. Can you be appointed for a new patient examination within a few days or weeks, or is it a 2-month wait for the next available appointment? A long wait may indicate an office that would be too busy to see you quickly if an emergency ever arose. You may even want to visit the office before actually making an appointment. When you arrive, look at the cleanliness of the office. Are there "dust bunnies" in the corners, or is the office neat and tidy? A clean office

is usually a more efficient one and often is particular about sterilization and disinfection. Is the staff friendly and do they greet you as soon as you arrive?

On the day of your appointment, a staff member should seat you in the treatment room close to your appointment time, or if an unusual circumstance has arisen. you should be told your approximate wait time. Once seated, your medical and dental history should be discussed with you, and you should be asked if you have any specific concerns or requests. When you look around the office, does it seem "up-to-date" on technology? Digital x-rays, intraoral cameras, and computers in the operatories are some of the technologies that many updated offices have as well as CAD/CAM equipment for making crowns and other restorations in the office in one appointment. When you receive your initial examination by the dentist, the exam should be thorough, checking not only for decay and broken or cracked teeth, but also for oral cancer or other facial pathology, occlusion (bite) issues and TMJ problems. The exam should include gum measurements to check for periodontal disease as well as questions about the quality of your sleep to be sure there are no sleep breathing disorders.

A "good" dentist educates you with photos and descriptions of the condition of your mouth and works WITH you to develop a treatment plan. He or she is willing to tailor the plan to your finances, goals, and desires, advising you on ideal treatment, but altering the plan or the sequencing of the treatment if needed to help you complete it. Prices do not always reflect quality of treatment. High prices don't necessarily correspond to high quality treatment, but bargain shopping is also not a good idea when it comes to your health! Having a feeling of trust and that the dentist is ethical is one of the most important factors in the dentist-patient relationship; after all, if the dentist is highly skilled, but cares nothing about you, is he or she really a "good" dentist?

Finding a dentist you trust with your family's dental health can sometimes be a daunting process. Seeking "word of mouth" recommendations and reading reviews

combined with telephone or in-person interviews of the office can help you narrow your search to someone whom you will hopefully find to be that caring, ethical, gentle, knowledgeable professional you are looking for!

2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION RECAP

The 2019 Georgia legislative session ended on April 2, 2019. The PTA was very active again this year in advocating for public education and all of Georgia's children. Here's a recap of some of the PTA's successes at the gold dome this year.

Dyslexia bill: SB 48 is awaiting the Governor's signature and will establish a 3-year pilot program in 3 systems for a dyslexia screening program for Kindergarten students, with the intent for all districts to implement in 2024-2025. The law also creates an endorsement program for teachers, and other measures.

Recess bill: HB 83 has been sent to the Governor for signature and requires 30 minutes of recess for K-5 students on days without PE or other programs/events, preferably outside. Also prohibits removing recess for disciplinary reasons.

School Safety: SB15 the "Keeping Georgia Schools Safe Act" is awaiting Governor Kemp's signature. The bill was amended in the House to allow the school safety officer (principal or principal's designee) to report student criminal activity based upon "reasonable suspicion" to local law enforcement.

Voucher Bill: Many of our PTA/PTSA members called and emailed their legislators to ask them to vote NO on the proposed school voucher legislation. Largely due to PTA members speaking out against the proposed voucher legislation the measure was defeated.

Local control of school calendar: A senate study committee considered proposal of a state mandated start and end date for all of Georgia's school systems. Georgia PTA and other education groups spoke against this and advocated for local control of the school calendar by each

district's school board. The ECCC PTA passed a resolution asking our Cobb legislation to cease discussion of the measure. Discussion stopped and the calendar decisions remain with the local school boards.

The ECCC PTA greatly appreciates the efforts of all of our members in advocating for all of our schools and our children. Your voice matters! Here are some ways to get more information on important issues and stay involved:

- Invite your legislators to your school events (PTA meetings, Career Days, International Night, College and Career Fairs, etc.). If you aren't sure who your legislators are, you can find out at this link: www.mvp.sos.ga.gov/ MVP/mvp.do
- Register to vote.
- Attend town hall sessions where your legislators and candidates can share their stance on issues affecting education.
- Hold voter registration drives for your school's families – especially high school students.

Being informed and involved helps us maintain the strong East Cobb schools that are such a vital part of our community. •

CROSSROADS GARDEN CELEBRATES A DECADE OF COMMUNITY GARDENING



In the midst of our East Cobb community resides a garden, nurtured and supported by community members. CrossRoads Community Garden, located behind Chestnut Ridge Christian Church off Johnson Ferry Road, is still yielding produce for both local charities and the gardeners who tend it after ten productive years.

Debbie Abernathy, church member and Cobb County Master Gardener, talks about the garden's beginnings in April 2009: "A proposal to create a community garden to make use of vacant space behind the church was introduced to the congregation. Our great church said, 'We see it on the hill, and we can make it happen."

Within a month, Abernathy, Rev. Byron Wells, and several church members met on that hill, constructed the first 3 raised beds, and mixed the soil. The garden came to life.

Fast forward to April 13, 2019. Church members, gardeners, and community supporters gathered to celebrate a decade of CrossRoads community gardening with food and fellowship. The garden has grown to 85 beds, with 74 leased, 8 designated

as sources for the Feed the Hungry program, a children's garden, grape trellis, and berry patch.

"From the very first lease, community gardeners were asked to donate 10 percent of their harvest for charitable giving," says Abernathy. "Over the past 10 years, the best recorded donation year totaled 1,387 pounds -- not bad for 8 Feed the Hungry beds and a 10 percent voluntary donation!"

Charitable recipients have included Center for Family Resources, First Christian Church of Marietta, MUST Ministries, and NE Cobb YMCA summer feeding program.

CrossRoads has truly been a community project. Abernathy gives accolades to many groups, including

Chestnut Ridge Christian Church that had the vision and generosity to make it happen with funds when needed, insurance, free use of property, as well as member sweat equity and prayers. Local Boy Scout troops have completed Eagle building projects at the garden while Master Gardeners of Cobb County have helped with education, hard work, and financial support in the early years. The Cobb County government has supported the project as well.


At the 10-year celebration, Abernathy thanked the individuals who have toiled in the garden over the years. "Thank you for our terrific community gardeners who work hard, donate 10 percent to local food pantries, and grow wonderful fresh food," she says. "But Marilyn Richter from CrossRoads and Bobbie Wilson from the American Community Gardening Association like to say a community garden is 10 percent vegetables and 90 percent community. I agree. Here we grow friendships, share laughter and tears, encourage each other, teach, give, pray, and have quiet moments of reflection in God's world."

STAN WARD NAMED EAST COBB FIREFIGHTER OF THE YEAR

n Thursday, March 21 at the sixth annual Firefighters Awards Banquet, Stan Ward was named this year's East Cobb Firefighter of the Year. Stan puts in countless time and energy toward helping others in the community, his station, the department and to the fire service as a whole. Stan has been with the Cobb County Fire and Emergency Services (CCFES) Department for over 6 years. He obtained his paramedic certification in 2015 and has immersed himself in the fire service.

Stan is an adjunct instructor with the Cobb County
Fire Department training division and is a member of
the "Big Water" group, Ladders group, Forcible Entry
group and High Rise group. He attends and leads training opportunities both within CCFES and outside the
department, on and off-duty. He is a lead instructor for
the Metro Atlanta Firefighter's Conference (MAFFC), a
subject matter expert for Forcible Entry and tool maintenance and he attended last year's Fire Department
Instructor's Conference (FDIC) in Indianapolis, IN as both
a student and instructor. He has eagerly shared the
knowledge and skills he has learned with members of his
station, battalion and the department. In fact, one of the
training props that he helped develop is currently being
used in this years' department wide spring drill.

He is known for his pride and ownership of tools/ equipment, apparatus and the station that he is assigned to by treating each as if it belonged to him. He regular-





ly serves as a mentor to other firefighters, helping them develop their skills. His professional demeanor and conduct makes him a go-to when interacting with the public.

One of his current passions is the Shield Council, which develops and implements plans to honor retired members of our department. His peers chose him to be the lead for this project and he averages 12-15 hours a week over the last 3 years creating items for the station retirement walls.

He and his crew recently responded to a patient in cardiac arrest. Using his paramedic skills, he and his crew successfully resuscitated the patient and he has now returned to his normal lifestyle.

For these and many other reasons, Firefighter Stan Ward has been chosen as the East Cobb Firefighter of the Year. Stan is an enormous asset to the Cobb County Fire Department. Congratulations to Stan on his many accomplishments, this award and for being selected as the 2019 Cobb County Firefighter of the Year! Great job Lieutenant Stan Ward! FF Ward is currently assigned to Station 19 on Powers Ferry Road.

learning firsthand with their students.

"Summer is the perfect time for kids to learn. They don't have to worry about homework or grades, so they are free to explore and learn at a faster pace," says Frank.



Frank and Montse Fabregas met in New York while in a program in Columbia University 25 years ago. They raised their children in Barcelona and then chose to move back to the United States for the educational experience. They have one son at the University of Barcelona and another at Lassiter High School. They chose to make East Cobb their home because of our high ranking schools and how parents make education a priority here.

Huntington works with the youngest learners from kindergarten to second grade, many struggling with phonics and reading. It also works with older children who may lack math, reading, writing or study skills. They will work with the students intensively to improve their skills, track grades and assignments from school and help them with weekly study plans based on what's a priority. They partner with parents and schools, so everyone is working together on behalf of the student.

"Struggling in school can impact a child's self-esteem, and we nurture and support each child, in addition to teaching them the subject matter," says Frank.

For high school students, Huntington provides also math, reading and study skills and other tutoring, but it also provides

measurable improvement with standardized tests like the ACT and SAT. East Cobb mom Malin shares how the experience helped her son. "My son wanted to raise his ACT scores to open more college and scholarship

opportunities. After studying and preparing at the Huntington Learning Center, he was able to raise his ACT score by six points," says Malin.

Frank recommends that students take the ACT or SAT early in their junior year so they should prepare for these tests in their sophomore year and the summer prior to being a junior.

Their East Cobb location has designated rooms for each program. The main room hosts separate work spaces for the Huntington Math Program, Huntington Reading or Study Skills Programs. They have private rooms for ACT / SAT / SSAT exam prep and subject tutoring of any kind, and provide a large room with curriculum for the little ones. MAY IS MENTAL HEALTH MONTH



or 70 years, the United States has recognized May as Mental Health Month. According to the Centers for Disease Control, one in five Americans will experience mental illness in a given year, and one in 25 Americans lives with a serious mental illness. The costs can be staggering: the National Alliance on Mental Health (NAMI) says that serious mental illness costs the United States approximately \$190 billion each year in lost earnings.

While the dollar cost is high for our community, the personal cost is even higher. Here in Cobb County, between 2011-2015, suicide was the third leading cause of premature death. The number one leading cause of premature death during the same time period was accidental poisoning and exposure to noxious substances, including accidental overdoses of legal and illegal drugs.

The barriers to receiving help may seem difficult to overcome. The perception of the stigma of mental health challenges often prevents people from seeking therapy. Equally important is that, according to Mental Health America, more than 5.3 million adults with mental illness remain uninsured—creating a false sense that help is not available.

Agencies like the Cobb County Community Services Board were set up to assist those who have behavioral health challenges and who are without insurance or who cannot afford to pay the co-payment of their insurance plan. We offer a myriad of services at our

There is no single cause for mental illness, but with counseling and treatment, recovery from behavioral health challenges is possible. Recognizing Mental Health and offering solutions is a first step in a path forward.






