




ECCC PTA RECOGNIZES

OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS







School; and Devanshu Tiwari, Wheeler High School. The scholarship was established in 1989 to honor the dedication and years of service by Mrs. Hatfield to the ECCC PTA and the East Cobb community. The scholarship recognizes and awards outstanding seniors who have demonstrated a commitment to service and citizenship in the genuine spirit of PTA. The winners, each of whom received a \$1,000 cash award to be used to further their education, were selected on the basis of their applications, personal essays and letters of recommendation. Funded by the local units of the ECCC PTA and donations from community members, the scholarship program has awarded over \$100,000 to students over the years. All of the winners contribute to our community in significant ways through school and community activities.

For the first time in the history of awarding these scholarships, the ECCC PTA was unable to have an in person celebration of these students due to COVID-19 related school closures.



showed she was struggling with reading comprehension, and it was impacting her in all subjects. After a short time



at Huntington, her school work improved tremendously, and her confidence increased. I've also seen this program benefit my middle school son and

the high school students that I tutor in Spanish. Some of them are missing basic skills that can impact their overall educational success. Huntington helps build that foundation for learning."

"Summer is the perfect time for kids to learn. They don't have to worry about homework or grades, so they are free to explore and learn at a faster pace," says Frank.

Frank and Montse Fabregas met in New York 25 years ago while both were enrolled in a program at Columbia University. They raised their children in Barcelona and then chose to move back to the United States for the educational experience. They have one son who graduated from the University of Barcelona and another who just graduated from Lassiter High School and will attend the University of Georgia this fall. They chose 15 years ago, to make East Cobb their home because of our both the high ranked schools and the culture of how parents make education a priority.

Huntington can work with young learners from kindergarten to second grade, many who struggle with phonics and reading. Huntington can also work with older children, who may lack math, reading, writing, or study skills. They will work with the students intensively to improve their skills, track grades, and assignments from school and help them with weekly study plans based on what's a priority. They partner with parents and schools, so everyone works together on behalf of the student.

"Struggling in school can impact a child's self-esteem, and we nurture and support each child, in addition to teaching them the subject matter," says Frank.

For high school students, Huntington tutors in math, reading, study skills and other topics. However, they also can provide

measurable improvement with standardized tests like the ACT and SAT. East Cobb mom Malin shares how the experience helped her son: "My son wanted to raise his ACT scores to open more college and scholarship opportunities. After studying and preparing at the Huntington Learning Center, he was able to raise his ACT score by six points."

Frank recommends that students take the ACT or SAT early in their junior year, therefore they should prepare for the tests in their sophomore year and the summer prior to their junior year.

Frank shared they now have the ability to tutor online 1-on-1, as well as tutor in-person as long as they follow strict guidelines as set down by the CDC. Right now, Huntington in East Cobb utilizes plastic barriers to work with students in close proximity. Huntington provides masks for students and tutors, and requires all individuals inside the building to have their temperature checked prior to entry. Parents must drop off the student and pick up outside. Safety is one of Huntington's top priorities during this time.

Frank and Montse take pride in the family atmosphere at the center. "Our vision is to be the educational choice for local families who want support and academic success for their kids."

HOW COVID-19 MAY CHANGE YOUR VISIT TO THE DENTIST

Never in our lifetime have we experienced such a worldwide health crisis as we are currently. Protecting the health of ourselves, our families, and our community members has become a major group effort! Wearing masks, frequent hand washing, and sanitizer use is now the norm for everyone. Infection control has always been a top priority for us at Cheek Dental, but COVID-19 has certainly put our procedures to the test!

Dental offices have been given special infection control recommendations and guidelines for COVID by the American Dental Association (ADA), the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). There is so much new information for us dentists to sort through during this pandemic! Many dental offices were closed for two months, and their dental employees, including ours, certainly did not get to enjoy a 60-day "staycation." During the time that our practice was closed, we worked to develop new protocols to prevent the spread of COVID within our dental office as well as researched the types of personal protective equipment needed to keep our employees safe.

Some changes you may notice at your next visit with your dentist are...

- A call or message before your appointment asking some COVID screening questions. (It is highly likely that you will again be asked those same questions once you arrive at the office.)
- Having to wait in your car instead of in the reception area to maintain social distancing.
- Empty reception rooms with will no magazines or children's toys since those items are difficult to clean and disinfect.
- Having to wash your hands or use hand sanitizer upon arrival as well as having your temperature taken.
 You may even be asked to use a special mouth rinse.
- Medical grade air purifiers in the office to help pull viral particles out of the air.
- The dental team wearing an increased amount of protective equipment including double masks or respirators, eyewear, visors, and head coverings as well as jackets or gowns.

 The need for a sweater since the office temperature will likely be lowered as the staff will feel hot wearing all the extra protective equipment.

These are just a few of the changes we have implemented for the safety of ourselves and our patients. Our team actually has a multiple page document that we have assembled of all the necessary steps we are taking to ensure that each patient and team member is protected to the best of our ability. But we love what we do, so we

will do what it takes to keep practicing dentistry and serving our community. Stay safe and be sure to keep up with your oral health during this time as we know there is a link between dental and overall health!

EAST COBBER PARADE + FESTIVAL

CANCELLED DUE TO COVID

The 2020 EAST COBBER Parade and Festival has been canceled this year due to COVID-19 concerns. Organizers say the cancellation is in compliance with public health rules, with the hometown tradition to resume next year—bigger and better! Under current rules, community events and large gatherings are still prohibited. With the focus on the health and safety of participants and spectators, organizers said canceling at this time is necessary.

"This year would have been the 25th annual EAST COBBER Parade . . . I've had many conversations in the past several weeks weighing out the risks and rewards of holding the parade, says Cynthia Rozzo, Founder and Publisher of the EAST COBBER magazine.

Cynthia Rozzo, who has organized the parade annually for 25 years, said the outbreak of the disease and the uncertainty about when it will end led her to decide to cancel this year's parade. It's the right thing to do," Rozzo said. "I hated to do it. It was a very hard decision to make."

"The annual parade takes months of planning and preparation to pull off, between securing permission to close roads to hold it and lining up participants as well as other behind-the-scenes steps that have to be taken. Those planning steps have been hampered by the outbreak and the uncertainty about it, the parade's founder and organizer said.

"We're in a situation that nobody has been in before, and there's just too many facets of the parade and festival that have to happen that cannot be finalized because of the coronavirus situation," Rozzo said.



The EAST COBBER Parade and Festival was slated to be held at September 19, 2020. Founded in 1993, EAST COBBER extended its mission of building a sense of community by establishing a hometown tradition of a community parade and festival. As the producers of the first parade and festival in East Cobb County, the EAST COBBER aims to establish a strong network between schools, businesses, government and clubs to create a showcase event and annual tradition for East Cobb County. The EAST COBBER Parade has become the largest parade in all of Cobb County and is the only community-wide event for East Cobb.


