

EAST COBB RESIDENT HELPS RAISE OVER \$1,700 FOR THE DRAKE HOUSE

The Drake House is an agency that empowers women and their children experiencing homelessness to achieve economic independence and long-term stability. There are many ways to support The Drake House. One way is to shop at The Drake Closet, a boutique that sells new and gently used women's clothing, shoes, and accessories, with 100% of the proceeds going back to The Drake House.

East Cobber Amy Rees, Founder and Creator of Personality Plates, recently hosted a Ladies Night Fundraising event at The Drake Closet in Roswell. The event brought out more than 70 women to shop for a good cause. Collectively, they were able to raise over \$1700, as well as many donations of clothing and accessories brought in for future sales.

"The Drake Closet volunteers went above and beyond making the event feel like one big party. It was an incredible night," says Rees, "Women came from all over Atlanta to connect, shop, and learn about the important work The Drake House is doing."

The Drake House provides emergency and transitional program-enriched housing for single mothers and their children who are experiencing homelessness. The agency has provided nearly 200,000 bed nights to homeless families since 2006. More than 545 female-headed families have entered the program, including over 1028 children.

"It was so heartening to have women who are both business owners and leaders in the community, come out

DO YOU SLEEP WELL?

Would you be surprised if your dentist asked you about sleep during your routine dental exam? While it may seem like an odd question, many sleep disorders have oral indicators. By looking for signs such as tooth grinding (bruxism), small jaw size, a tongue with scalloped edges, large tonsils or redness in the throat, dentists have the unique ability to identify patients who may suffer from sleep disorders.

Sleep apnea is one such common and serious sleep disorder that affects an estimated 18 million Americans according to the National Sleep Foundation. Sleep apnea occurs when the muscles and tissues in the back of the throat relax and collapse the airway while you sleep. As air tries to pass through the collapsed airway, the tissues can vibrate causing snoring. However, in some cases, the collapsed airway blocks airflow so severely that you stop breathing. This pause in airflow can last a few seconds to minutes before your body responds by waking you up, allowing airflow to resume. For some, this may occur 30 or more times per hour. This pattern of air deprivation and breath resumption is sleep apnea. Left untreated, sleep apnea can cause multiple health complications including chronic fatigue, high blood pressure, stroke, heart failure, irregular heartbeat and heart attack, diabetes, depression, worsening of ADHD, and more.

In addition to identifying patients who may have sleep apnea, dentists are also uniquely able to

help treat sleep apnea. Sleep apnea is primarily treated by using either a continuous positive air pressure (CPAP) device or an oral appliance made by a dentist (a mandibular advancement device). While the CPAP device opens the blocked airway by forcing air down your throat through a mask, the mandibular advancement device positions the lower jaw forward, preventing muscle collapse and maintaining an open airway. Research has shown that mandibular advancement devices can successfully prevent sleep apnea in many mild to moderate cases. It is important to note that while dentists can suspect someone has sleep apnea and refer them for a sleep study, only a medical doctor can make an official diagnosis of sleep apnea.

The next time you visit your dentist, don't be surprised if they ask you how you sleep! Not only will we be looking for cavities and other oral ailments, but also signs of a sleep disorder. We care not only about the health of your teeth, but your overall health as well!







HOME & GARDEN

Staying on top of daily, monthly, and annual chores around your home is a big job. Maintenance and repair jobs are constants. To save time and money, plan for the seasonal needs of your home, yard, and garden. Here's a spring checklist to keep your home humming.

Home & Garden Checklist

Get going on your spring cleaning. Pick one room to start in and make a list of what you want to do. Then begin working off each item on your list. Do this with each room, and just progress through the house.

Take your vacuum and use the proper attachment to clean the exhaust fan in your bathroom. It will operate much more efficiently and that can help prevent mildew, mold and paint problems.

Install a programmable thermostat. It takes less than 30 minutes to hook up but can save up to 20 percent in energy costs.

As spring starts, check your basement for cracks or leaks. If you see moisture, call a professional to check it out. Many homeowner's insurance policies no longer cover fungus or mildew damage, so sealing basements is more important than ever.

Build arbors and trellises before transplanting or sowing seeds for vines and gourds

Little air leaks add up to 10 percent or more on your energy bill. Plug them to keep the hot air outside where it belongs. Caulk cracks and weather-strip doors and windows. Don't like the look of caulk or weather stripping? Consider using a weather- resistant foam sealant. It resists moisture and can be sanded, painted and stained for a more appealing look.

Carpet cleaning is a must for any home. All winter long, your windows and doors were mainly closed to keep out the cold. This prevented the fresh flow of air to air out your home's contents. Now that the weather is getting warmer, it's time to freshen up your carpets and rugs. Dust will accumulate inside your smoke detector, possibly causing it to give a false alarm. After checking the battery this month, take the top off and vacuum the inside. Also, batteries should be replaced once per year and the detector itself needs replacing about every 10 years.

Daylight Savings Time begins Sunday, March 12. Spring forward by setting your clocks forward one hour. Ensure that all smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and fire extinguishers are in good working order. Replace batteries in appropriate devices as needed, or at least twice each year.

Make room to store winter equipment and clothing by bringing out your spring and summer items.

Do you clean out your coffeemaker regularly? Vinegar is a good way to clean it thoroughly and disinfect it as well.

Dig out and remove rotted or damaged fence posts, mailbox posts and damaged shrubs from around your home. It is also a good time to remove winter worn branches from tree and shrubs.

Get into the spring of things with fresh flowers like potted pink tulips, yellow daffodils or purple irises. Even if the weather is still wintry outside, you are reminded of what will be growing in your own garden.

The first day of Spring is March 20! Go outside and breathe in the new season.







eet Danialle Vesser. Danialle is 49 years old and lives in Marietta (East Cobb). She and her husband have been married for 28 years and have three grown young men, one daughter-in-love, and her first grandbaby.

ARP is once again helping Cobb County residents file their taxes on time and correct. There is no charge for the service, and all tax preparers are trained by AARP. AARP Tax-Aide is the nation's largest, free, volunteer-run tax assistance and preparation service. AARP Tax-Aide volunteers prepare federal, state and local tax returns for taxpayers who have straightforward tax returns starting February 3 through April 15. Membership in AARP is not required and the service is available to everyone regardless of age. Appointments are not required and electronic filing is available at all locations.

Taxpayers should bring their 2021 return and all 2022 tax documents. Each taxpayer must also present their social security cards or other identification documents for themselves and all dependents.

For direct deposit refunds, taxpayers must have their checkbook and a valid blank or canceled check.




