

### ARE YOU SEEING RED THIS VALENTINE'S DAY?

When you brush your teeth, do you see red on your toothbrush bristles or on your floss? Bleeding when you clean your teeth is often an indication that you have inflammation in your gums which is a sign of gum disease. According to the American Heart Association, there is a strong association between gum disease and heart disease, and heart disease is the number one killer of both men and women in the United States!

Gum disease, also referred to as periodontal disease, is an infection of the tissues that surround and support your teeth. When you do not floss and brush well, the sticky film of bacteria called plaque which is constantly forming on your teeth, begins a process of inflammation that leads to infection. This early stage of gum disease is called gingivitis. If you have gingivitis, your gums may become red, swollen and bleed easily. At this stage, the disease is reversible and can usually be eliminated by a professional cleaning at your dental office followed by daily brushing and flossing. Advanced gum disease is called periodontitis. It can lead to the loss of tissue and bone that support the teeth, and it may become more severe over time, causing the teeth to become loose. Chronic periodontitis affects almost half of adults over 30 in the United States and is a major cause of tooth loss in adults.

While the exact link between gum disease and heart disease remains undetermined, there is a growing suspicion that gum disease is a significant risk factor for heart disease. In fact, we are finding that people with gum disease have two to three times the risk of having a heart attack, stroke, or other serious cardiovascular event. Though it has not yet been proven that treating gum disease will prevent heart disease, the connection is compelling enough that both dentists and doctors agree patients should strive to prevent developing gum disease in the first place. To avoid gum disease and maintain good oral health, the American Dental Association suggests:

- Brushing twice a day with an ADA-accepted fluoride toothpaste.
- Cleaning between teeth daily with floss or an interdental cleaner.
- Eating a balanced diet and limiting between-meal snacks.
- Visiting your dentist regularly for oral examinations and professional cleanings.

It should also be mentioned that in addition to heart disease, gum disease has also been associated with health conditions such as diabetes, pneumonia, pregnancy complications, dementia and more. For this reason, we believe taking care of your oral health is an investment in your overall health! If this Valentine's day you are seeing red when cleaning your teeth, make an appointment with your dentist!

These student winners represent twenty-one local schools, include all grade levels, all categories, plus the special artists division, in an impressive collection which we are proud to have represent our Council at the State level program.



Leora Bargal and Joshua Canaan, two top Mossad counterterrorism operatives, are enlisted to work with Detective Alex Ramirez and FBI agents to thwart Iran's plan to bomb a New York cultural hub, the 92nd Street Y. Iran's Quds Force has formed Unit 840. Its goal is to inflict maximum casualties on Jews worldwide. ### POLL WORKERS **NEEDED**



f you are interested in serving your community and earning a little extra cash, the Cobb County Board of Elections is looking for people to work at voting precincts during the 2024 elections cycle. They are looking for applicants who take pride in their work, are patient, take direction well, and who pay attention to detail. A poll worker must be a U.S. citizen, Cobb County resident, at least 16 years old, be able to read, write and speak English and not have any felony conviction in the past 10 years.

Poll workers must attend at least one mandatory training class before working at the poll. New workers are paid for Election Day, for the training class and for helping to set up the poll. Workers must arrive at 6am on Election Day and stay until all voters leave and closing procedures are completed. You must provide your own transportation to your scheduled training class and to the poll on Election Day.

### **VOTER REGISTRATION** DEADLINE FEBRUARY 12



The Presidential Preference Primary is "Super Tuesday." It looks and feels like an election but it is a preference event. Your "vote" helps the state parties decide who they will support at their Presidential Conventions.

The deadline for registering to vote in the March 12 presidential preference primary election is Monday, February 12, 2024.

Here are the different ways you can register to vote in Cobb County:

- 1. **REGISTER** online at the Secretary of State's website: www.mvp.sos.ga.gov/MVP.
- 2. **VISIT** in person at the Cobb Board of Elections main office located at 995 Roswell Street NE, Marietta, 30060. Hours: Monday-Friday: 8am-5pm.
- 3. **CALL** 770-528-2581 to request that an application be mailed to you. Mail-in applications must be postmarked by 30 days prior to the election.
- 4. **REGISTER** to vote when you get your driver's license.
- 5. **REGISTER** at any Cobb County Library when you apply for a library card; or any time you are at a library you may pick up a blank application and mail it in yourself.

**Note:** If you move within Cobb County you must notify 30 days prior to the election.

Recently, I cut back my workout routine to heal my adrenal and cortisol levels, reducing stress on my body.

As a Sparkle Ambassador, I am passionate about promoting wellness. I take pride in teaching cooking classes, going beyond traditional recipes. ### AARP TAX-AIDE OFFERS FREE TAX HELP

ARP is once again helping Cobb County residents file their taxes on time and correct. There is no charge for the service, and all tax preparers are trained by AARP. AARP Tax-Aide is the nation's largest, free, volunteer-run tax assistance and preparation service. AARP Tax-Aide volunteers prepare federal, state and local tax returns for taxpayers who have straightforward tax returns starting February 1 through April 11. Membership in AARP is not required and the service is available to everyone regardless of age. Appointments are not required and electronic filing is available at all locations.

Taxpayers should bring their 2022 return and all 2023 tax documents. Each taxpayer must also present their social security cards or other identification documents for themselves and all dependents.

For direct deposit refunds, taxpayers must have their checkbook and a valid blank or canceled check.
